The Point, Eastcliffe: archaeological memo

Introduction

Generus Living are planning a development at the end of Te Arawa Street, Ōrākei, Auckland, 1071. It is intended to apply for a fast-track consent to undertake the works. Richard Mora of Generus Living commissioned CFG Heritage Ltd to prepare a memo outlining potential archaeological and heritage constraints of the works for fast-track consent purposes.

Results

NZAA SRS - There are no archaeological sites recorded in the NZAA SRS within 200 m of the works area.

CHI - There are no sites listed in the Auckland Council Cultural Heritage Inventory (CHI) within 200 m of the proposed works area.

AUP - There are no sites listed in the Auckland Unitary Plan (AUP) Historic Heritage List within 200 m of the proposed works area.

Landscape – While there are no recorded sites, Takaparawhau / Bastion Point is widely accepted as a largely unrecorded archaeological landscape.

Summary

There are no previously recorded archaeological or heritage sites in the immediate vicinity the proposed works. Archaeological features, if found, will contribute to understanding the pre-European Māori human history of the area and hold high information values as pā are poorly researched in this part of the country. While this is true, archaeological effects can be managed suitably within the current mechanisms for heritage management and there are no heritage constraints on the work.

No archaeological or heritage constraints have been identified that cannot be addressed within the usual approaches for heritage management.
