I accept that the proposed work on the WIAL seawalls is essential.

My comments are:

Community Liaison Group.

This must include representatives from Moa Point Road. Why were they not in the suggested list? A strange clerical error!! Why limit the number to 5?

Managing noise and vibration.

Although there are predictions in the Tomkin and Taylor report on Noise and vibration it is not known yet how disturbing this will be in reality especially at night. Proposed mitigation may not prove sufficient. Will complaints result in cessation of work if levels are too high for the residents in Moa Point and Strathmore Park?

Existing coastal erosion.

There is extensive and continuing erosion at the northern end (eastern end of the southern seawall) of Moa Point beach, acknowledged by both WIAL and WCC. I had hoped that both parties would be co-ordinating efforts to remediate this. But I understand that the seawall will not extend into the WCC reserve and WCC's policy on coastal erosion is "let nature take it's course." Has the planning of the seawalls repair taken account of possible changes in wave action and their potential to increase erosion and impinge on the integrity of the south eastern end of the seawall at Moa Point?
