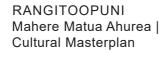

LOT 2: LANDSCAPE STATEMENT

THE PROPOSAL:

The Rangitoopuni project is the catalyst project for the prosperous economic future of Te Kawerau a Maki, by the Rangitoopuni Development Limited Partnership. Taking the former Riverhead production pine forest, with many recreational pursuits within its confines, the project will transform the landscape in to a diverse and rich native bush environment with the Senior Living Village development at it's heart.

EXISTING SITE:

The existing site is/has been clothed in production pine trees for the last 60 plus years. This has always been important whenua for Te Kawerau a Maki with important events and stories captured in the names of the area. The mana of the site has been diminished with forestry activities, weed ingress and waterway sedimentation.

Access into the forest is largely uncontrolled for recreation activities such as mountain biking, horse riding, walking and running, motocross events and hunting.

THE LANDSCAPE OUTCOME:

This development project will see, in the long term, a richly planted and diverse landscape, supporting birds and insects and the people who have chosen to live within this setting. Public access for walking, biking and horse riding will not be constrained on the road network. The tracks within the development areas are pedestrian access only due to the topography.

Te Kawerau a Maki will be Kaitiaki over the plantings and tracks, their knowledge of the land, plants and fauna will be passed onto the residents and visitors through mahi toi, wananga, mara hupara and mara kai. Once in the development, you will know you are on Te Kawerau a Maki whenua.

LOT 2:

The Senior Living Village consists of individual living units, a garden pavilion area, an amenity building housing the restaurant and café amongst other activities, a wellness centre with pool and spa, pickle ball and putting green; and a care facility.

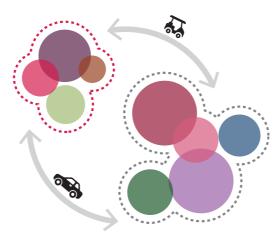
Native plantings will be the dominant palate however a select schedule of exotic amenity plants (that have proven to be non-invasive) will be used to provide the environments for the senior living village residents. An extensive fringe of planting and gullies that run into the village will be extensively revegetated. Walking tracks are provided around the perimeter of the village, these link to the internal road network to vary the length of the circuits. A golf cart access track to Riverhead will be available for the residents.

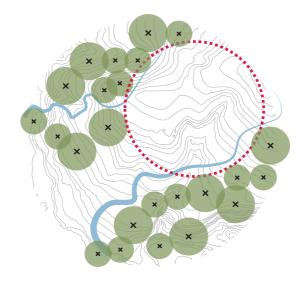


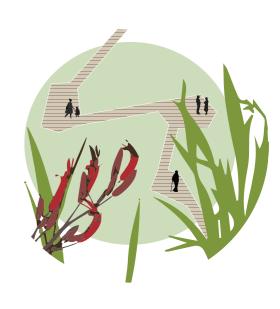

COMMUNITY LIVING

Creating a community heart with a variety of spaces and environments give residents choice. Positioning the Garden Pavilion & Wellness Buildings at the head of the awe provides them with a strong visual connection down to the streams.

ENVIRONMENT

The revegetation surrounding the development forms the protective toopuni, while the awe encroach into the village, integrating nature into the built environment to enhance biodiversity and the site's natural character.

LEVELS

Working with the natural topography of the site.
Roads, connections, and housing typologies will respond to the moderate slope withing the boundaries.

MOVEMENT

Walking tracks, garden paths and footpaths traverse the site creating connections to the wider pedestrian and walking routes for exercise and recreation.

LOT 2 : CULTURAL NARRATIVE

Rangitoopuni Retirement Village sits within the wider Rangitoopuni development area of Te Kawerau aa Maki. This area itself sits in the middle of three of Takiwa of Te Kawerau aa Maki, Hikurangi, Poa Taniwha and Kahu.

A key narrative for the area relates to the naming of the place Rangitoopuni. Translating to the day of the dog-skin cloaks, it speaks to a day of peacemaking between great chiefs including those of Te Kawerau aa Maki. There were also other areas on the way to Te Henga that are named for similar peace-making hui, named Kahutoopuni and Kaahuikurii. The toopuni itself is a dog-skin cloak that is regarded with the highest prestige and respect. It is only worn by chiefs of very high rank due to the intricate nature of the weaving and the time required to make such a piece.

Another key narrative of the area relates to Ruarangi and his wanderings. Coming into conflict with his brother, Ruarangi was chased from Ihumatao, through to Te Ahi Kaa a Rakataura where he jumped into a rfemnant lava cave that took him to the Waitemataa. From here Ruarangi, still being chased, swam avross the harbour and into the Rangitoopuni stream where he jumped out and began hiding in the ngahere (forest) by the awa. Not wanting to be spotted during the light of day, Ruarangi did a karakia to keep the night going longer where he then made his escape out to Muriwai.

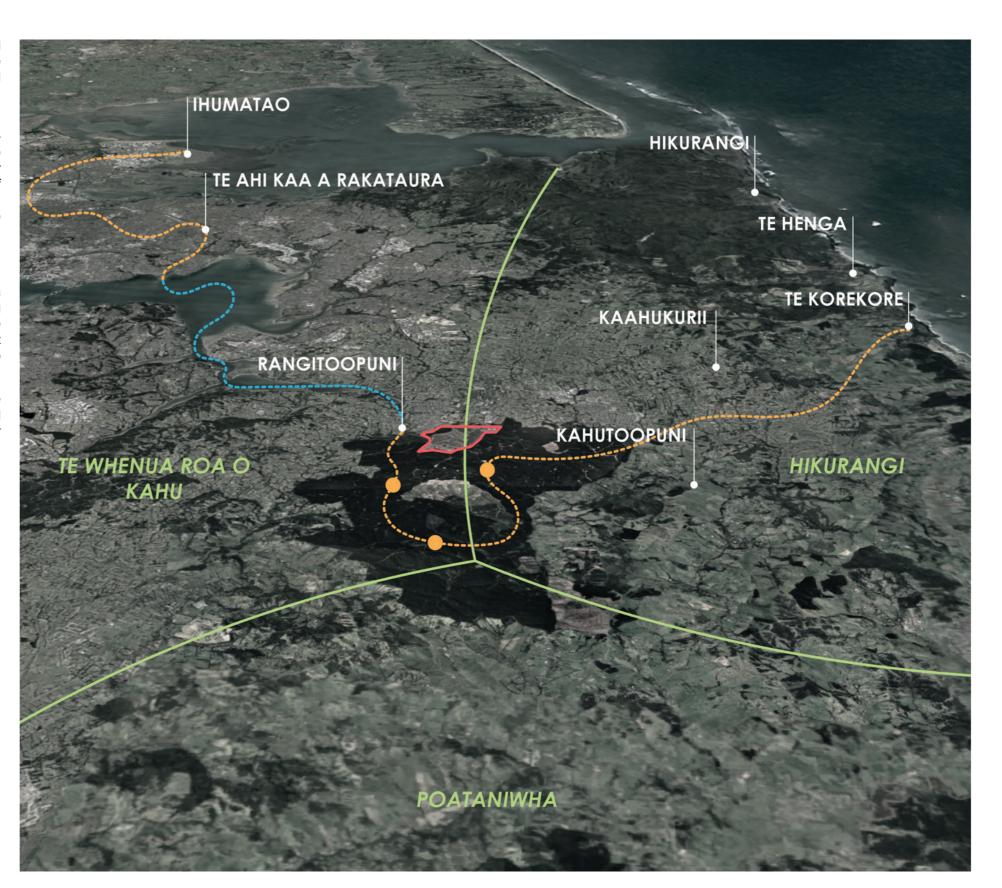
One of the most important parts of the Rangitoopuni area was the traditional ngahere that was present. Home to the forest giant Kauri as well as otherspecies such as Akeake, this area was a very important place for Māori in general.

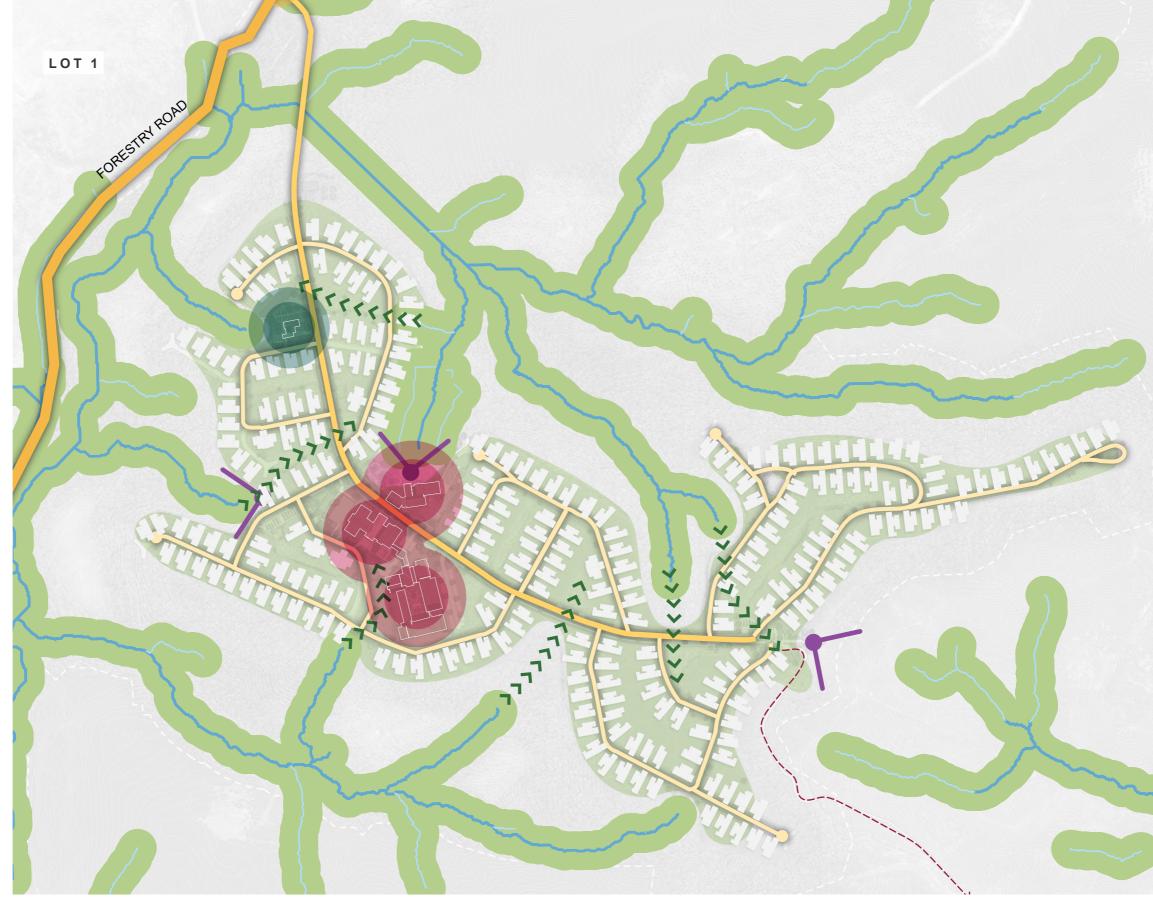

PRODUCTION GARDENS

PRODUCTION GARDENS IN A RETIREMENT VILLAGE ARE COMMUNITY-DRIVEN SPACES WHERE RESIDENTS CAN ENGAGE IN GARDENING ACTIVITIES. THESE GARDENS PROVIDE A WONDERFUL OPPORTUNITY FOR RETIREES TO GROW THEIR OWN FRUITS, VEGETABLES, AND FLOWERS, FOSTERING A SENSE OF PURPOSE AND COMMUNITY.

THE GARDEN LAYOUT HAS BEEN INSPIRED BY A TRADITIONAL MĀORI MĀRA (GARDEN) WITH CAREFUL CONSIDERATION OF THE ENVIRONMENT AND CULTURAL PRACTICES INCLUDING THE USE OF THE MARAMATAKA (MĀORI LUNAR CALENDAR) TO GUIDE PLANTING AND HARVESTING TIMES.

ATRIUM

THE ATRIUM IS A VIBRANT SOCIAL HUB WHERE RESIDENTS CAN GATHER, SHARE A COFFEE, AND ENJOY A MEAL IN A RELAXED SETTING. DESIGNED AS AN INVITING INDOOR-OUTDOOR SPACE, IT OFFERS COMFORTABLE SEATING, COMMUNAL TABLES, AND A SEAMLESS CONNECTION TO THE SURROUNDING GARDENS, MAKING IT A PERFECT SPOT FOR CONVERSATION AND CONNECTION.

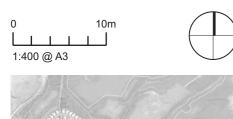
SOCIAL AMENITY

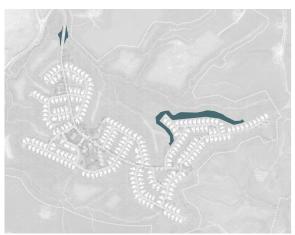
