I have reviewed the comments and evidence prepared by Forest and Bird / CRC and my assessment (Ecological Solutions Limited 2023) still stands.

Ms McArthur refers to four flow options in para 95 of her evidence. I have reviewed these options and in my opinion the catchment-wide IBEP compensation package proffered will result in better ecological outcomes for vegetation and wetlands in the upper Tākapō River than any of the flow options suggested.
