#### Section 20 - request further information

Under section 20 of the Act, I am writing to request the following further information:

1. Whether the Council considers the project would have significant regional or national benefits, and in that context, whether the Council has any high-level comments on the project's alignment with any respective plans, policies or strategies

#### Response:

Auckland Council engaged consultant economist Susan Fairgray-Mclean from Market Economics Ltd review the Economic Assessment lodged in support of the Pohutukawa Business Park fast track referral application. Susan was asked to:

- Identifies whether the scope of the applicants' economic assessment has identified and sufficiently covers the likely economic issues of the proposal (taking account of the fast-track legislative requirements).
- To determine whether sufficient assessment has been undertaken to support the conclusions contained in the report, including whether or not it

demonstrates that the project is likely to have significant regional or national benefits.

In summary Susan Fairgray-Mclean review of the applicant's economic report has outlined the following:

The economic assessment has only established the *regional* significance of the project to a limited extent. This is important within the context of the FTAA assessment to understand the full regional significance of the project.

There is an important distinction between economic effects likely to be experienced locally vs. effects experienced at a broader scale. This is a key aspect for the assessment to address given that it is for a relatively small development (within a regional context) located within the outer peripheral area of Auckland away from the larger markets and regional infrastructural connections within the main metropolitan area.

Parts of the economic assessment have identified and explained economic benefits that are likely to be experienced within the surrounding area, with effects limited to the local market. For instance, these include increased local employment and amenity, and increased competition within local industrial market. However, the economic assessment has not established a basis for economic effects to be likely to occur beyond the local area, nor to a scale where they are likely to be regionally significant or materially affect wider land markets.

The review also noted the importance of potential effects on the local commercial development pattern on the contribution to a well-functioning urban environment within this location. This effect is likely to have greater local significance than in relation to understanding the regional significance of the proposal within the context of the FTAA.

#### In conclusion:

- Due to the above information, Auckland Council considers that the project would not have significant regional or national benefits.
- However, Council also considers that the project is in general alignment with relevant plans, policies and strategies, aside from some objectives and policies associated with the Auckland Unitary Plans Whitford Precinct or Rural Zone which the proposal is not consistent with. Council generally agrees with the information outlined in section 6.0 of the lodged document titled "Planning Summary in relation to a referral application for a fast track by Knight Investments Limited", dated 16 June 2025 and drafted by Tollemache Consultants Ltd.

Thank you for the invitation to provide comments on the application for referral of the Pohutukawa Business Park to an expert panel under section 17 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (FTAA).

Having reviewed the referral application, you may wish to use your discretion to specify information that is required to be provided with the substantive application under section 27(3)(b)(ii) of the FTAA. This would ensure the most streamlined process for the applicant.

I suggest the following could be specified to support a thorough and evidence-based determination on the significance of effects at the substantive stage:

a. an assessment of how coastal inundation/flooding will impact infill stability in the former quarry area, particularly how this relates to groundwater.

This approach will reduce the risk of unanticipated significant matters being identified late in the process and will support the smooth and efficient conduct of the expert panel's deliberations and the process for the applicants.
