## **Suspension of processing**

- [1] This Minute responds to the applicant's memorandum of counsel dated 6 October 2025. - [2] The suspension requested at paragraph [1.4] of the memorandum is granted by the Panel, under section 64(3) of the FTAA. The suspension commences from and including today, Tuesday 7 October 2025.
- [3] The Panel is particularly keen to ensure that, when undertaking its decision-making, it has to hand the updated conditions that the applicant proposes to address the matters raised in our requests for information and in the comments received further to invitations.
- [4] The Panel was made aware of clarification from the EPA yesterday that, during any suspension "all processing of the application needs to pause, including any work by the panel and EPA. No costs can be incurred during the suspension period." This is to apply even where an applicant indicates that it is content for work to continue.

[5] It is not currently clear to the Panel whether technical review work (such as that

being undertaken by Mr Williamson), and expert conferencing (particularly, facilitated

conferencing), would be able to occur. Putting it more bluntly, while those steps could

practically occur, the issue would be whether the individuals involved in those processes

would be able to invoice for their time, if that time was spent during a suspension.

[6] We have sought advice on these matters from the EPA. Once we have that

clarification to hand we will be able to consider the applicant's proposed amended

timetable included at Annexure A of their memorandum. We express our thanks to the

applicant for their proactive consideration of process and timing matters.

[7] A short teleconference following lodgement of the next conditions set would be

appropriate (i.e. next week), and the Panel has asked the EPA to make arrangements for

that.
