Introduction

- My full name is Edward Ashby. I am an anthropologist and CEO of Te Kawerau Iwi Tiaki Trust. I hold an MA in anthropology and a PGDip in forensic science from the University of Auckland, with a focus on cultural resource management and forensic archaeology.
- 2. I have 20 years' experience in anthropology and have held the role of CEO with Te Kawerau Iwi Tiaki Trust since 2021. My experience includes contract archaeology in Auckland and Tauranga from 2004-2010. In 2011 I worked for the Coronial Services specialising in supporting the missing persons coroner and developing forensic archaeological protocols with the coroners, MoJ, police, Heritage NZ, forensic pathologists, ESR, and bioanthropologists. In 2015 I held the role of archaeologist with Arup based in London where my work included heritage assessment for the High-Speed Rail 2 project and A1 Bypass in the Stonehenge World Heritage Site. In 2018 I held the role of senior specialist Māori heritage at Auckland Council where my work focused on mapping iwi heritage sites, developing Council's Māori heritage alert layer, and progressing plan changes for the Māori heritage schedule 12 in the AUP. In this role I provided expert evidence to council hearings. I have held various roles with Te Kawerau ā Maki since February 2013 including as environment and heritage manager and assisted the iwi in the final stages of the Treaty Settlement.
- 3. My work with Te Kawerau has involved many cultural impact assessments, consultation on masterplans, resource consents, and plan changes. I have provided expert evidence on behalf of Te Kawerau in council hearings and environment court proceedings. While I would not claim to be an expert in Te Kawerau tikanga I have extensive knowledge of Te Kawerau heritage sites, history, cultural values, and practice that has developed over 12 years through a combination of my training, work experience, research, and direct learning from kaumatua.

- 4. In support of this fast-track application by Rangitoopuni Developments Limited Partnership, I have prepared the following material lodged in support of the application:
 - Report titled Riverhead Forest Cultural Impact Assessment dated
 March 2025 included as an Appendix to the Rangitoopuni
 Assessment of Environmental Effects.
