







# Kings Quarry – Stage 2 Expansion

February 2023 | Presentation to the Ministry for the Environment




- Located in Wainui, Auckland approximately 10km to the west of State Highway 1
- Close to Future Urban growth areas







- Landholding of approximately 167ha in area
- Quarried between mid-1930s to 1995
- Resource consent obtained in 2021 for the re-establishment of the quarry – 'Stage 1':
  - 262,000m³ of aggregate per year for two years
  - New accessway and roading upgrades





- Foundation product crucial to economic activity in New Zealand including development of buildings, roading and infrastructure
- Low-value, high-weight product which doesn't travel well – a 30 tonne truck of aggregate doubles in cost for every 30km travelled
- Shortage of aggregate supply locally in Auckland with heavy reliance on Waikato and wider regions.
   Auckland supply currently only meeting 56% of the demand
- Some products sourced from even further afield –
   e.g. decorative pebbles from Manawatu region






- Based on current production, the Auckland region does not have enough production capacity to support itself into the future and the current supply deficit will continue to worsen
- Auckland's demand to increase from 13.1m tonnes to 17.6-19.4m tonnes by 2043, with only 7.39m tonnes currently produced
- Quarry operators are facing challenges as urban growth takes up potential quarry sites
- Flow on effects including more difficult consenting pathways caused by reverse sensitivity effects and rezoning of land for urban use is limiting quarry establishment



- Approximately 500,000 tonnes/year to be extracted for approximately 60 years
- Aggregate is processed into:
  - Gap products metals used as base course for driveways etc.
  - Construction sand used in concrete production and field and turf industries
  - Decorative river pebbles used in landscaping and exposed concrete floors (particularly significant given current supply to Auckland comes from Manawatu region)
- Overburden (unsuitable material) to be distributed in fill sites






Semenoff Group Site Boundary

Auckland Unitary Plan - Special Purpose Area - Quarry Zone Extent




Stage 2 - Proposed Pit Extent

Stage 1 - Access Road Extent




Stage | - Pit Re-Establishment Extent

- Stage 1 main access and roading upgrades are suitable to service Stage 2
- Vegetation removal approximately 25ha of regenerating bush (lowest ecological value)
- No buildings or structures
- No need for stormwater, wastewater or water supply infrastructure
- Stream works required
- Proposed covenant over 90ha of mature kauri podocarp forest
- Restoration and weed and pest management plan



- Subject to the Auckland Unitary Plan
- Special Purpose Quarry Zone provides for significant mineral extraction activities to ensure that mineral extraction can continue in a manner that minimises significant adverse effects and demand can be met, where possible, from sources within Auckland
- Encircled by Quarry Buffer Area overlay intended to protect quarry from reverse sensitivity effects






Rural Production Zone






Almost all of the site is subject to

- Auckland Unitary Plan:
  - Land use mineral extraction, land disturbance and vegetation removal
     controlled & restricted discretionary activities
  - Streamworks removal of permanent and intermittent streams within an SEA overlay – non-complying activity
  - Water permit groundwater diversion may be required restricted discretionary activity
  - Discharge permit air discharge for mineral extraction activities controlled activity
- National Environmental Standards for Freshwater:
  - Removal of beds of rivers (permanent and intermittent streams) discretionary activity



- Faster realisation of project through fast-track
  - Based on scale of the project, consenting complexities, and possible appeals, a time saving of approximately 36 months is expected under fast-track
- Economic benefits
  - Approximately \$285.7m in value over its 60-year duration
  - From time-saving associated with fast-track vs RMA processes:
    - \$12.3m more value added
    - Transport cost savings of between \$24.4m and \$28.8m over three years for Auckland's construction sector in avoided costs
    - A total of \$1.4m in emissions cost savings



- Employment
  - Direct employment 5.1 Modified Employee Counts ('MECs') annually, totalling 306 MECs
  - Indirect employment 8.4 MECs annually, totalling 504 MECs
  - Induced employment 13.6 MECs annually, totalling 816 MECs
  - Total employment 27 MECs annually, totalling 1620 MECs
- Contribution to well-functioning urban environments and provision of infrastructure
  - Aggregate is a foundation product which is necessary for the development of buildings, roading and infrastructure.
  - Increasing its supply and proximity to key growth areas will result in reduced costs for Auckland's construction sector and therefore reduce barriers to intensification and the development of well-functioning urban environments



- Increase of local aggregate supply = saving in bulk transport that will have a positive immediate benefit in reducing New Zealand's transport related greenhouse gas emissions
- Estimated reduction of 2,026 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>
  equivalent greenhouse gases could be achieved
  annually = ~0.06% of New Zealand's total heavy
  vehicle CO<sub>2</sub> equivalent GHG emissions





### None anticipated:

- Land disturbance effects can be managed through appropriate erosion and sediment control measures
- Groundwater diversion based on separation distances and the location of neighbouring buildings and structures, adverse effects associated with any drawdown and settlements related to groundwater diversion are not expected
- Rural character and visual amenity noting the Quarry zoning of the site, some change in the landscape must be expected, however these effects will be mitigated by the progressive rehabilitation of the quarry pits as part of each stage of the works
- Dust can be managed through a Quarry Management Plan
- Noise can be managed to comply with the AUP limits
- Archaeology there is an archaeological site, which the pit and overburden areas can be designed to avoid



### None anticipated:

- Transport the upgrades already consented for Stage 1 can accommodate Stage 2, and internal accessways can be appropriately designed for intended use
- Cultural values consultation was undertaken with iwi as part of Stage 1, and will be continued for Stage 2
- Greenhouse gas emissions as noted above, significant benefits are identified
- Ecology the effects management hierarchy will be applied in relation to adverse effects associated with the removal of the regenerating native vegetation and streams, and it is anticipated that with the proposed mitigation and offsetting, the applicant intends to achieve a no net loss outcome



- Kings Quarry is a regionally-significant quarry, specifically zoned for that purpose
- Represents a valuable aggregate source for Auckland, noting only 56% of Auckland demand is met by local quarries
- Advantageous location, being in close proximity to growth areas
- Economic benefits include \$285.7m in value overall, as well as savings associated with fast-track timeframes of \$12.3m in value and \$24.4-28.8m in avoided transport costs for the construction sector
- Employment opportunities created are 27 MECs per annum, being 1620 in total
- Estimated reduction of 2,026 tonnes of  $CO_2$  equivalent greenhouse gases annually =  $^{\circ}0.06\%$  of New Zealand's total heavy vehicle  $CO_2$  equivalent GHG emissions
- Adverse effects can be managed
- Achieves the purpose of the FTCA

We are getting in touch to follow up on our earlier consultation in respect of the substantial application for the Kings Quarry Expansion – Stage 2 listed project, pursuant to sections 29(1)(a) and 11(1) of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (FTAA).

We are contacting you on behalf of the applicant, Kings Quarry Limited, regarding the proposed expansion of quarrying activities at Kings Quarry. The proposal seeks to enable the extraction of approximately 500,000 tonnes of Albany Conglomerate aggregate per year for a period of up to 45 years. To facilitate the Project, it is proposed to undertake vegetation removal, earthworks and land disturbance, stream reclamation, diversion/dewatering of groundwater and discharges to air. A comprehensive offsetting and compensation package is proposed to address adverse effects of the removal of indigenous biodiversity through the vegetation and stream removals.

We note that a pre-application meeting was held with the Ministry for the Environment (MfE) in February 2023 to discuss the proposal under the Fast-track Consenting Act (FTCA). Since then, correspondence and consultation attempts on this project has been directed to the following MfE addresses:





## Kings Quarry Expansion – Stage 2 – Pre-lodgement consultation under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (FTAA)

Thank you for your correspondence dated 17 April 2025 in relation to Kings Quarry Limited's intention to lodge a substantive application for a listed project under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (FTAA) in respect of the "Kings Quarry Expansion – Stage 2" project.

As you are aware, the Ministry for the Environment (the Ministry) is the "relevant administering agency" for approvals relating to the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) and Exclusive Economic Zone and Continental Shelf (Environmental Effects) Act 2012 (EEZ Act) under the FTAA.

We have received the information you provided on 17 April 2025. As part of your substantive application, you will need to provide an assessment of the project against any relevant national policy statement, national environmental standards and if relevant the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement. The Ministry has prepared the following summary on the national direction made under the RMA, for your consideration.

#### **National Direction**

Under the RMA, the government can create national direction to support local authorities' decision making under the RMA and develop a nationally consistent approach to resource management issues. This is typically done where an issue is of national importance, or involves significant national benefits or costs, or where necessary to give effect to other government policy or regulation. There are several types of national direction, including national policy statements and national environmental standards.

#### National Policy Statements (NPS)

National Policy Statements are instruments issued under section 52(2) of the RMA. An NPS is a vehicle for the government to prescribe objectives and policies for matters which are relevant to sustainable management. All National Policy Statements currently in force are published on the Ministry's website and links are provided in the table below. It is recommended that you consider the relevance of each NPS to your project. If you are seeking an RMA approval, then under section 13(4)(y)(i) and schedule 5 paragraph 2 of the FTAA your application must include an assessment of your project against any relevant NPSs. Refer to the National Policy Statements linked below.

National Policy Statement	Description

National Policy Statement for Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Industrial Process Heat 2023	This NPS provides nationally consistent policies and requirements for reducing greenhouse gas emissions from industries using process heat. It works alongside the National Environmental Standards for Greenhouse Gases from Industrial Process.
National Policy Statement for Highly Productive Land 2022	This NPS provides national direction to improve the way highly productive land is managed under the RMA. The objective is to ensure the availability of New Zealand's most favourable soils for food and fibre production.
National Policy Statement for Freshwater  Management 2020	This NPS provides local authorities with updated national direction on how they should manage freshwater under the RMA.
National Policy Statement for Indigenous Biodiversity 2023	This NPS provides direction to local authorities to protect, maintain and restore indigenous biodiversity requiring at least no further reduction in indigenous biodiversity nationally.
National Policy Statement for Renewable Electricity Generation 2011	This NPS provides guidance for local authorities on how renewable electricity generation should be dealt with in RMA planning documents.
National Policy Statement on Electricity <u>Transmission</u>	This NPS sets out the objective and policies for managing the electricity transmission network.
National Policy Statement on Urban Development 2020	This NPS recognises the national significance of well-functioning urban environments. It removes barriers to development to allow growth in locations that have good access to existing services, public transport networks and infrastructure.
New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement 2010	The NZCPS provides guidance for local authorities in their day-to-day management of the coastal environment. The NZCPS is the only compulsory NPS under the RMA.

#### National Environmental Standards (NES)

National Environmental Standards are regulations issued under section 43 of the RMA. They prescribe technical and non-technical standards, methods or other requirements for land use and subdivision, use of the coastal marine area and beds of lakes and rivers, water take and use, discharges and noise. NESs require each local authority to enforce the same standard in respect of these areas unless otherwise specified. All National Policy Statements currently in force are published on the Ministry's website and links are provided in the table below. It is recommended that you consider the relevance of each NES to your project.

If you are seeking an RMA approval under the FTAA, section 13(4)(y)(i) and schedule 5 paragraph 2 require that an assessment of your project against any relevant NES must be included with your application. Refer to the National Environmental Standards linked below.

National Environmental Standards for Marine Aquaculture	This NES replaces regional council rules for existing marine farms and provides a more certain and efficient process for replacing consents, realigning farms and changing farmed species. In some instances, they allow regional council rules to remain in force.
National Environmental Standards for Sources of Human Drinking Water	This NES sets requirements to protect sources of human drinking water from becoming contaminated.
National Environmental Standards for Storing Tyres Outdoors	This NES provides nationally consistent rules for the responsible storage of tyres.
National Environmental Standards for Telecommunication Facilities	This NES sets national rules regarding the deployment of telecommunications infrastructure across New Zealand.
National Environmental Standard for Assessing and Managing Contaminants in Soil to Protect Human Health	This NES includes requirements for assessing and managing potentially contaminated soil.
