


Land Status Report – Makaroro Riverbed

Evidence

Introduction

The Property comprises a portion of land located within the legal boundaries of the Makaroro River. In determining the land status (ownership) of this land, we have investigated the acquisition history of the nearby Ruahine State Forest Park and the Gwavas Forest.

Acquisition History

The following section of this report follows a chronological acquisition history and interpretation of survey and Gazettal records. This has provided evidence of ownership of the Property.

May 1881 New Zealand Gazette 1881 page 667 temporarily reserved land in the Wakarara Survey District for the "growth and preservation of timber" pursuant to section 144 of the Land Act 1877.

NZGZ 1881 P 667.

Section 114 of the Land Act 1877 allows the Governor to temporarily reserve Crown lands for a certain purpose by publication in the NZ Gazette. One month following such publication, the land can be permanently reserved pursuant to section 145 of the Land Act 1877. The land had not yet been surveyed.

July 1881 New Zealand Gazette 1881 page 959 permanently reserved land in Wakarara pursuant to section 145 of the Land Act 1877, for the purposes of "Growth and preservation of timber".



February 1900

By NZ Gazette Notice 1900 page 429, the Governor set apart land forming part of the Crown lands for State Forest pursuant to The New Zealand State Forests Act 1885, including 10,450 acres more or less in the Ngaruroro and Wakarara Survey Districts.



January 1968

SO 5833, being a plan of land to be declared State Forest, was approved for record purposes on 18 January 1968.

The existing State Forest (declared via NZGZ 1900 page 429 above) is also depicted on this plan, with the Property making up part of this area and located at the junction of the Makaroro River and Makaroro Stream.

January 1976 New Zealand Gazette Notice 1976 page 69 set apart State forest land as a State forest park known as "Ruahine State Forest Park" pursuant to section 63A(1)(a) of the Forests Act 1949.




January 1979 SO 7439 is a plan of Section 8 Block IX Wakarara SD, which is located on the opposite side of the Makaroro River from the Property. We can see from this survey that the Property has been shown distinct from the Makaroro Riverbed.

January 1991


DP 21614, being a plan for the purposes of the Crown Forests Assets Act 1989, was approved as to survey on 14 January 1991.



EXTRACT FROM DP 21614.


The plan depicts the Property as being a land parcel distinct from the Makaroro River.

May 1991 SO 10158, being a Crown Forest Plan, was certified correct for the purposes of the Crown Forest Assets Act 1989 on 16 May 1991. The Property was not taken for Crown Forest, but has been depicted as being distinct from the Makaroro Riverbed.

April 1997 SO 9356 being a Department of Conservation allocation plan of State Forest lands was created on 16 April 1997. This plan shows which lands are to be allocated to the Department of Conservation as part of NZMS 281 U22.

The following information was obtained from the face of SO 9356:

- The land was transferred to the Department of Conservation under section 60 of the Conservation Act 1987.

"State Forest lands transferring to the Department of Conservation pursuant to Section 60 Conservation Act 1987 do not form part of this plan for the purposes of Section 60A Conservation Act 1987"

- A cabinet paper of 17 December 1987 is referred to on the face of SO 9356, as noted on the face of SO Plan 9356:

"Approved as to amendments made in accordance with Cabinet decision of 17 December 1987."

- The Ruahine State Forest Park (which includes the Property and other nearby land marked '1' on the above extract from SO 9356) is deemed to be a Conservation Park pursuant to section 61(2) of the Conservation Act 1987.

DOC MAP "Certified as correct for the purpose of Section 62 Conservation Act 1987."

Survey would be required to determine the metes and bounds of the Property.


The Schedule for SO 9356 refers to the parcels labelled '1' (which includes the Property) and confirms the landowner is deemed to be the Department of Conservation.

In addition to the above, SO 9334 was drafted, being a State Owned Enterprise (SOE) map. SO 9334 defines Crown Land and State Forest to be transferred to an SOE

pursuant to the State-owned Enterprises Act 1986. The land to be transferred is shown outlined in bold black lines. We can see from this plan that the Property was specifically excluded from the area to be transferred.

Statutory Interpretation

Conservation Act 1987

Section 60 – Acquisition of land for administrative purposes

- (1) *The Director-General may acquire land or any interest in land for the purposes of the Department and the due administration of this Act.*
- (2) *The Director-General may on behalf of the Sovereign, without complying with any provision of this Act (other than [section 50\(2\)](#)) or any provision of the [Land Act 1948](#), dispose of—*
 - (a) *any land acquired under subsection (1); or*
 - (b) *any interest in any such land; or*
 - (c) *any interest in land (being an interest acquired under subsection (1))—*
if the land concerned is, at the time of disposal, neither a conservation area nor Crown land.

Section 60F – Record of title in respect of conservation areas

- (1) *On the written request of the Director-General in respect of any of the land for the time being held under this Act for conservation purposes or for the purposes of the Department, the Registrar-General of Land must issue a record or records of title under the [Land Transfer Act 2017](#) (in the name of the Sovereign for conservation purposes or for the purposes of the Department).*

- (2) For the purposes only of the [Land Transfer Act 2017](#), a request under subsection (1) is conclusive evidence that the land to which it relates is held under this Act for conservation purposes or, as the case requires, for the purposes of the Department.
- (3) If the survey of any land is inadequate for the issue of a record of title under subsection (1), the Registrar-General of Land may require the Director-General to deposit such other plan as the Registrar-General of Land, after consultation with the Surveyor-General, thinks sufficient to comply with [section 224](#) of the Land Transfer Act 2017.

Section 61 – Certain former State Forest land to become protected area on commencement of Act

- (2) Any land that, immediately before the commencement of this Act, —
- (a) **was a forest park; and**
- (b) was not shown on any plan lodged in the office of the Chief Surveyor for the land district in which it is situated (being a plan certified as correct for the purposes of section 24 of the State-Owned Enterprises Act 1986 by the Chief Surveyor) as being allocated for possible transfer to a State enterprise, —
- shall, until it, —
- (c) is declared to be held for conservation purposes under section 7(1);
- (d) or is vested in a State enterprise under the said section 24, —
- be deemed to be a conservation park.**
- (Emphasis added)
- (3) When any land to which subsection (2) applies is declared to be held for conservation purposes under [section 7\(1\)](#), it shall be deemed to have been declared to be held for the purpose of a conservation park by a notice in the Gazette under [section 18\(1\)](#).
- (9) Until it is—
- (a) declared to be held for conservation purposes under [section 7\(1\)](#); or
- (b) vested in a State enterprise under [section 24](#) of the State-Owned Enterprises Act 1986,—
- all land that is deemed by this section to be a conservation park, a wilderness area, or an ecological area shall be deemed to be held under this Act for conservation purposes; but neither it nor any interest in it shall be disposed of except by vesting as aforesaid.**
- (Emphasis added)
- (10) Nothing in subsection (9) restricts or prevents the granting under this Act of a concession over any land.

As seen in the acquisition history, the Property was part of a forest park prior to the commencement of the Conservation Act 1987, and was specifically excluded from SO 9334 (being an SOE plan).

We have not viewed any evidence to suggest that the Property was subsequently declared to be held for conservation purposes or vested in a State enterprise.

Therefore, the Property is a conservation park pursuant to section 61(2) of the Conservation Act 1987. This definition applies regardless of whether the land had been transferred to DOC under section 60.

A Conservation Park is described in section 19:

Section 19 – Conservation parks

(1) *Every conservation park shall so be managed—*

- (a) that its natural and historic resources are protected; and*
- (b) subject to paragraph (a), to facilitate public recreation and enjoyment.*

(2) *Where a committee is constituted by or under regulations made under subsection (3) in respect of any conservation park, it may advise the Minister on the area’s management.*

(3) *The Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, make regulations constituting, or providing for the constitution, appointment, or election, of a committee to advise the Minister on the management of any conservation park or parks, and defining its functions.*

[subsections 4 and 5 omitted]

We have searched for regulations made under the authority of section 19(3) but have not found any.

Section 7(1A) authorises deemed Conservation Park to be declared held for Conservation Purposes (note section 7(1) is included for context):

7 Land may be acquired and held for conservation purposes

- (1) The Minister, and the Minister responsible for an agency or department of State that has control of any land, may jointly, by notice in the Gazette describing it, declare that the land is held for conservation purposes; and, subject to this Act, it shall thereafter be so held.*

(1A) Notwithstanding subsection (1), in the case of any land to which [section 61](#) or [section 62](#) applies, the Minister may, by notice in the Gazette describing it, declare that the land is held for conservation purposes; and, subject to this Act, it shall thereafter be so held.

(Emphasis added)

Hawkes Bay Regional Investment Company Ltd v. Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society of New Zealand Inc [2017] NZSC 106

This Supreme Court decision relates to the revocation by the Minister of Conservation of an area of conservation park under s 18(7) of the Conservation Act 1987 to facilitate an exchange of land. While the decision is noted, no detailed commentary or analysis is considered necessary for the purposes of this report.

Crown Forest Assets Act 1989

The Crown Forest Assets Act 1989 provides for:

- (a) the management of the Crown’s forest assets:
- (b) the transfer of those assets while at the same time protecting the claims of Maori under the Treaty of Waitangi Act 1975:
- (c) in the case of successful claims by Maori under that Act, the transfer of Crown forest land to Maori ownership and for payment by the Crown to Maori of compensation:
- (d) other incidental matters

The Gwavas Forest (as depicted on DP 21614 and SO 10158) was subject to this Act and was later transferred to Heretaunga Tamatea as part of a settlement claim. We can see from the available evidence that the Property was not included within the Gwavas Forest or the settlement.

Aerial Imagery

From review of aerial imagery, it can be seen that the Property was originally surrounded by branches of the Makaroro River and the Makaroro Stream. It appears from more recent imagery that one of these branches is largely dry.





Declaring State Forests in the Land Districts of Auckland and Hawke's Bay.

(L.S.) RANFURLY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885," and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, Uchter John Mark, Earl of Ranfurly, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby set apart the forest land described in the Schedule hereto, forming part of the Crown lands in New Zealand, as and for State forests within the provisions of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Auckland and Hawke's Bay Land Districts, containing 134,204 acres, more or less, and situated in the Survey Districts of Whangaparaoa West, Raukumara West, Raukumara East, Hikurangi, Maungawaru, and Haparapara. Bounded generally on the north by Native land, the Waikura River, the Te Kumi No. 2 Block, and the Waikura Block; on the north-east and east by the Waikarema Block, the Ohinepoutea Block, the Raparapaririki No. 2 Block, the Ahiaparua Block, the Mangaparahi Block, the Honokawa Nos. 2, 3, 4, and 5 Blocks, the Tapuwaeroa Nos. 2c, 2s, and 2a Blocks/Sections 1 and 2 of Block I, and Section 2 of Block V., Mata Survey District; Sections 2, 3, and 4 of Block VIII., Hikurangi; the northern boundary of Section 1, Block XI., Hikurangi Survey District; a line bearing west 25° south from the north-west corner of the last-mentioned section to the Mangaokura No. 1 Block; the northern portion of the Mangaokura No. 1 Block aforesaid, and a line bearing west 8° south from a point on the south-west boundary of the last-mentioned block, distant about 140 chains from its southern extremity, to the eastern boundary of the Maungawaru Block; on the south-west by the Maungawaru Block; on the west and north-west by the Motu River, the Puketapuhiu Nos. 2a, 2, and 2s Blocks, and by Native land.



State Forest Land Set Apart as State Forest Park

DENIS BLUNDELL, Governor-General
A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 63A (1) (a) of the Forests Act 1949, I, Sir Edward Denis Blundell, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby set apart the State forest land described in the First Schedule hereto and further described in the Second Schedule hereto as a State forest park, to be known as Ruahine State Forest Park.

FIRST SCHEDULE

HAWKE'S BAY AND WELLINGTON LAND DISTRICTS—WELLINGTON CONSERVANCY—HAWKE'S BAY, RANGITIKEI, KIWITEA, WAIPAWA, POHANGINA, DANNEVIKKE AND WOODVILLE COUNTIES

FIRSTLY, all that area in the Wellington and Hawke's Bay Land Districts containing 90076 hectares, more or less, bounded by a line commencing at Trig. 
