Proposed Waipiro Bay Marina - Harbourmaster comments on January 2025 Proposal

You have asked me to provide comments on the proposal based on your discussion Document January 2025, and our initial discussion on 28th January 25.

Please note that these comments relate solely to my role in navigational safety, and the maritime infrastructure available for Northland waters. All environmental considerations and consenting requirements are outside my scope of expertise or area of authority.

Comments:

General points

- 1. In general, there is a severe shortage of moorings, marina berths and available options for storing vessels in Northland and particularly in the Bay of Islands. Any increase in options will no doubt be well received by the boating community.
- 2. There is also a shortage of quality launch facilities, with associated parking available, and this is particularly the case in the Waipiro Bay area. The facilities proposed look similar in quality to the Marsden cove marina, which is now one of the most popular launch facilities available in Northland.

Specific Points.

- 1. The proposed facility is close to a swing mooring area, we will need precise details and positions to determine if the mooring area is impacted, and any moorings affected
- 2. There will likely be a requirement for lit beacons or buoys to mark an exit and entrance channel for day and night. These will be the responsibility of the facility owner to own and maintain.
- 3. We will need more details on the size of vessels proposed, and depths, manoeuvring room, and widths of channels to ensure the facility can be safely navigated.
- 4. I note there are ends of piers. In some marinas these have ended up being used for berths. If this is going to be the case, this must be determined at the planning stage, as use of the ends and breakwaters at other marinas have caused issues with widths of channels, and complaints of wash and wake. If to be kept clear, they must remain clear clearly in any consent.









Extras for your consideration

- 1. Whilst as stated above outside my area of expertise, two issues of concern for NRC are sewage and bio fouling.
- 2. Sewage pump-out facilities should be made available for all vessels to be able to use.
- 3. You mentioned no haul out facilities were to be considered. However, I do suggest looking into an option for a temporary lift, inspect and clean option for vessels, with an approved catch facility for bio growth. These are very limited in options in Northland and I'm sure if an option will be very well received, and potentially a separate business venture. Building in at the planning stage will make this a more viable option.

I look forward to receiving more detailed information as plans progress.
