### DETERMINATION

The FTAA Expert Consenting Panel grants an archaeological authority pursuant to section 81 of the Fast Track Approvals Act 2024 and section 48 of the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014 in respect of the archaeological sites described above, within the areas specified in the location above, to New Zealand Transport Agency for earthworks associated with the construction of Te Ara Hauāuru, the Northwest Rapid Transit Project (East) between Waterview and Ian McKinnon Drive (archaeological works), subject to the following conditions:

### CONDITIONS OF AUTHORITY

No.	Condition
<b>Before Works</b>	
1	<b>Start Work Notification</b> Prior to the start of any archaeological works, the Authority Holder must advise Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga (HNZPT), Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei, Te Ākitai Waiohua, and Ngāti te Ata of the date when work will begin. This advice must be provided at least two working days before work starts.
2	<b>Archaeological Management Plan</b> The Authority Holder shall prepare an Archaeological Management Plan (AMP). The purpose of the AMP is to provide instructions for managing archaeological sites during the construction of the Project and compliance with the conditions of the authority.  The AMP shall include:

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Archaeological monitoring areas where there is a material risk of encountering an archaeological site;</li> <li>b. Roles and responsibilities of the Project Archaeologist and contractor;</li> <li>c. Training procedures;</li> <li>d. Discovery protocols; and</li> <li>e. Archaeological mitigation measures to apply in the event an archaeological site is encountered.</li> </ul> <p>At least 20 Working Days before starting archaeological works, the AMP shall be submitted to HNZPT for approval.</p> <p>The certified AMP shall be implemented and complied with for the duration of the Archaeological Authority.</p> <p>The Authority Holder may update the AMP by submitting the amended AMP in writing to HNZPT for approval.</p>
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3	<p><b>Site Briefing</b></p> <p>The Authority Holder must ensure that all contractors working on the Project are briefed on site by the <a href="#">section 45 Approved Person</a>, or their delegate, prior to any archaeological works commencing. The purpose of the briefing is to support subsequent compliance with the authority conditions.</p> <p>The briefing shall include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. the possibility of encountering archaeological sites,</li> <li>b. how to identify possible archaeological sites during works,</li> <li>c. the archaeological work required by the conditions of this authority if an archaeological site is encountered, and</li> <li>d. contractors' responsibilities with regard to notification of the discovery of archaeological evidence.</li> </ul>
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<a href="#">new</a>	<p><b>Landowner consent</b></p> <p><a href="#">The Authority Holder must provide HNZPT with the written consent of all landowners of the land subject to this Authority prior to any archaeological works commencing.</a></p>
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**During Works**

4	<p><b>Tikanga</b></p> <p><a href="#">In addition to any tikanga Māori protocols agreed, the following shall apply:</a></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. <a href="#">access for Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei, Te Ākitai Waiohua, and Ngāti te Ata</a> to any archaeological site encountered in order to undertake tikanga subject to any health and safety requirements.</li> <li>b. If any possible taonga or Māori artefacts are encountered, Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei, Te Ākitai Waiohua, and Ngāti te Ata shall be informed to enable appropriate tikanga to be undertaken, so long as all statutory requirements under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014 and the Protected Objects Act 1975 are met.</li> </ul>
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c. If any archaeological site is encountered and works modifying or destroying the archaeological site are undertaken, Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei, Te Ākitai Waiohūa, and Ngāti te Ata shall be provided with a copy of any reports and be given an opportunity to discuss it with the [section 45 Approved Person](#), if required.

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**5 Kōiwi Discovery**  
If any kōiwi (human remains) are encountered, the Authority Holder shall cease works within 20 metres (“setback area”) of the discovery. [HNZPT](#), New Zealand Police, Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei, Te Ākitai Waiohūa, and Ngāti te Ata must be advised immediately in accordance with Guidelines for Kōiwi Tangata/Human Remains (ASG8 2010). No further work in the setback area may take place until future actions have been agreed by all parties.

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**6 Monitoring**  
Any earthworks within the archaeological monitoring areas identified in the [AMP](#), must be monitored by the [section 45 Approved Person](#), who may appoint a person to carry out the monitoring on their behalf.

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**7 Investigation**  
Any archaeological site encountered during the exercise of this authority must be investigated, recorded and analysed in accordance with the [AMP](#).

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**new Annual Reporting**  
[Annually from the date of issue of this authority, the Authority Holder must submit to HNZPT a written report containing a summary of the progress of the activity and any archaeological findings.](#)

**After Works**

**new Work Completion Notification**  
[The Authority Holder shall advise HNZPT and Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei, Te Ākitai Waiohūa, and Ngāti te Ata of the completion of archaeological works within five working days of completion.](#)

**8 Completion of Archaeological Siteworks**  
Within 20 working days of the completion of the [archaeological works](#) associated with this authority, the Authority Holder shall ensure that:  
a. An interim report following the Archaeological Report Guideline (AGS12 2023) is submitted to [HNZPT](#), for inclusion in the [HNZPT](#), Archaeological Reports Digital Library.  
b. Site record forms are updated or submitted to the NZAA Site Recording Scheme.

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**9 Archaeological Records**

Within 12 months of the completion of the archaeological works, the Authority Holder shall ensure that a final report, completed following the Archaeological Report Guideline (AGS12 2023), is submitted to the HNZPT, for inclusion in the HNZPT Archaeological Reports Digital Library.

a. A digital copy of the final report shall be sent to HNZPT,

b. Digital copies of the final report shall be sent to Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei, Te Ākitai Waiohūa, and Ngāti te Ata,
