Good afternoon Links,

Sorry I have not been in contact. There has been a lot of communication in regards to the issue you raised earlier this year. We have been discussing the dust problem with the site developer along with neighbouring properties.

The site manager is going to ensure all staff undergo an environmental induction this coming spring to ensure they know their obligations towards dust mitigation when ever they are working at the quarry. We had some push back from the developer as the District Plan rules state that dust must be leaving the boundary of the property for a breach to have occurred, the photo you provided didn't show that. We have followed up with some more measures in their Environmental Management Plan that hopes to reduce dust impacts next summer.

I hope this will provide some relief when the place dries out again.

If you have any concerns feel free to raise the issue again, if you do have any photo's or footage that shows dust leaving the quarry boundaries we can try pushing for better measures such as sprinklers.
