Confirmation of skill and competency



I have the requisite competences for recognising and respecting Māori values through my experience as a section 45 archaeologist on projects with archaeological sites associated with Māori occupation and settlement. The recorded archaeological site is not a site of interest to Māori. However, there is potential for there to be other sites of interest to Māori within the Milldale development site. I have access to the appropriate cultural support if a site of interest to Māori is discovered as a result of the engagement Fulton Hogan Land Development Ltd has undertaken with tangata whenua.
