The Director-General of Conservation and the Minister of Conservation (the **Director-General**)
NZSki Limited (the **Wildlife Approval Holder**)

BACKGROUND

- A. The Director-General of Conservation and the Minister of Conservation are empowered to issue authorisations or consents for specified acts under the Wildlife Act 1953.
- B. The Wildlife Approval Holder proposes to undertake upgrades to the existing Remarkables Ski Area and expand the ski field into the adjacent Doolans Basin. The Project includes all construction, operation and maintenance activities associated with the construction, upgrade, operation and maintenance of the existing and expanded ski areas, and all associated remediation works.
- C. The Wildlife Approval Holder has applied for a wildlife approval under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 in relation to the Project.
- D. A wildlife approval granted under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 has force and effect for its duration, and according to its terms and conditions, as a lawful authority for the purposes of Part 5 of the Wildlife Act 1953 for the act or omission for which the approval was granted and is treated as if it were granted under that Act.
- E. This wildlife approval under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 in relation to the Project was granted by an expert panel on [add date].

OPERATIVE PARTS

The Wildlife Approval Holder has been authorised by an expert panel under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 to undertake the activities specified in this approval, subject to the terms and conditions contained in this approval and its schedules.

SCHEDULE 2: STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE APPROVAL

1. Interpretation

- 1.1 The Wildlife Approval Holder must provide a copy of these conditions to its employees, contractors or agents carrying out the Authorised Activity and explain the obligations under the conditions.
- 1.2 Where obligations bind more than one person, those obligations bind those persons jointly and separately.

2. What is being authorised?

- 2.1 The Authorised Activity may only be carried out on the Land described in Schedule 1, Item 2.
- 2.2 Any arrangements necessary for access over private land or leased land are the responsibility of the Wildlife Approval Holder.
- 2.3 The Wildlife Approval Holder must advise the Department of Conservation's local Operations Manager(s)(insert email address) prior to carrying out the Authorised Activity in the District (where possible, one week prior), when the Wildlife Approval Holder intends to carry out the Authorised Activity.
- 2.4 A copy of this Approval must be available on site at all times while carrying out the Authorised Activity.
- 2.5 The Wildlife Approval Holder must immediately notify the Director-General of any taxa found which are new to science. In addition, the Wildlife Approval Holder must lodge holotype specimens and a voucher specimen of any new taxa with a recognised national collection.

3. Who is authorised?

- 3.1 Only the Authorised Personnel described in Schedule 1, Item 3 are authorised to carry out the Authorised Activity, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Director-General.

4. How long is the approval for – the Term?

- 4.1 This approval commences and ends on the dates set out in Schedule 1, Item 4.

5. What are the liabilities?

- 5.1 The Wildlife Approval Holder agrees to exercise the approval at its own risk and releases, to the full extent permitted by law, the Director-General and the Director-General's employees and agents from all claims and demands of any kind and from all liability which may arise in respect of any accident, damage, or injury occurring to any person or property arising from the Wildlife Approval Holder's exercise of the Approval.
- 5.2 This indemnity is to continue after the expiry or termination of this approval in respect of any acts or omissions occurring or arising before its expiry or termination.

6. What about compliance with legislation and Director-General's notices and directions?

- 6.1 The Wildlife Approval Holder must comply with all statutes, bylaws and regulations, and other

statutory instruments associated with the Land. Without limitation, this includes the Conservation Act 1987 and the Acts listed in the First Schedule of that Act and all applicable health and safety legislation and regulation.

7. Can the Authority be revoked?

- 7.1 The Director-General may revoke this Authority at any time in respect of the whole or any part of the Authorised Activity (pursuant to clause 7(4) of Schedule 7 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024) if the Wildlife Approval Holder breaches any of the conditions of this Authority.
- 7.2 If the Director-General intends to revoke this Authority in whole or in part, the Director-General must give the Wildlife Approval Holder such prior notice as is reasonable and necessary in the circumstances.

8. How are notices sent and when are they received?

- 8.1 Any notice to be given under this approval by the Director-General is to be in writing and made by personal delivery, by pre-paid post or email to the Wildlife Approval Holder at the address, or email address specified in Schedule 1, Item 5. Any such notice is to be deemed to have been received:
- (a) in the case of personal delivery, on the date of delivery;
 - (b) in the case of post, on the 3rd working day after posting;
 - (c) in the case of email, on the date the email is sent provided the email is sent before 5 pm, otherwise it is deemed to have been received at 9 am on the next working day.
- 8.2 If the Wildlife Approval Holder's details specified in Schedule 1, Item 5 change then the Wildlife Approval Holder must notify the Director-General within 5 working days of such change.

9. What about the payment of costs?

- 9.1 The Wildlife Approval Holder must pay the standard Department of Conservation charge-out rates for any staff time and mileage required to monitor compliance with this approval and to investigate any alleged breaches of the terms and conditions of it.

10. Are there any Special Conditions?

- 10.1 Special conditions are specified in Schedule 3. In the event of inconsistency or conflict, the Special Conditions will prevail over this Schedule 2.

11. Can the approval be varied?

- 11.1 The Wildlife Approval Holder may apply to the Director-General for variations to this approval in accordance with clauses 7(2) and (3) of Schedule 7 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024.

SCHEDULE 3: SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. General

- 1.1 The Authorised Activity must be carried out in accordance with the documents listed in Schedule 1, Item 1 and in the application to the extent it relates to the Wildlife Approval.

2. Nest relocation

- 2.1 Where vegetation clearance or earthworks take place within the breeding season for Eastern Falcon (August-May) or New Zealand Pipit (August-February), nesting habitat within the disturbance footprint are to be surveyed ahead of time (no longer than 8-days prior to disturbance) and any nests identified. Where vegetation clearance or earthworks activities could cause direct disturbance to a nesting individual the actions described in 2.2 to 2.x will be undertaken.
- 2.2 If the survey required by Clause 2.1 identifies a nest, an exclusion zone will be established around the nest until any chicks have fledged. The exclusions zones must be:
- (a) 200m surrounding an Eastern Falcon nest;
 - (b) 50m surrounding a New Zealand Pipit nest; or,
 - (c) An alternative exclusion zone as defined by the suitably and qualified experienced practitioner approved under Schedule 2, Clause 3.
- 2.3 Where avoidance under Clause 2.2 is not practicable, the nest and/or chicks must be moved to a suitable, nearby alternative location and monitored to ensure the nest is not abandoned. If abandoned, chicks will be immediately delivered to a local rehabilitation facility capable of caring for the birds.
- 2.4 If the nest cannot be moved and if construction activities may cause harm to the adult birds, the nest (and eggs if present) must be destroyed, and the area disturbed as early in the season as possible to disperse the adults and allow for renesting elsewhere (only to be undertaken as a last resort).
- 2.5 All survey work and nest capture and relocation authorized under this permit will be undertaken and managed by the suitably qualified and experienced practitioner approved under Schedule 2, Clause 3 and undertaken in accordance with best practice capture, handling and release measures set out in the Department of Conservation's New Zealand National Bird Banding Scheme bird bander's manual.

3. Salvage

- 3.1 If required in writing by the Director-General, the Wildlife Approval Holder must make improvements to techniques (including catching, handling, releasing, preserving and storing), and take such other steps as directed by the Director-General.

4. Death of wildlife associated with Authorised Activities

- 4.1 If any Eastern Falcon or New Zealand Pipit should die during the approved activities, the Wildlife Approval Holder must:

- (a) inform the Whakatipu DOC Operations Manager (queenstown@doc.govt.nz) within 48 hours, chill the body if it can be delivered within 72 hours, or freeze the body if delivery will take longer than 72 hours; and
- (b) send the body to [insert name] for necropsy OR as otherwise advised by the Whakatipu DOC Operations Manager, along with details of the animal's history; and
- (c) pay for any costs incurred in investigation of the death of any Eastern Falcon or New Zealand Pipit; and
- (d) if required by the Whakatipu DOC Operations Manager, cease the Approved Activity for a period determined by the DOC Operations Manager.

Note: Condition 4.1 is intended to ensure activities occur according to best practice in the unforeseen event of an accidental death. This permit does not seek to authorize injury or killing of avifauna.

5. Euthanasia

- 5.1 If any Eastern Falcon or New Zealand Pipit are found injured as part of the Authorised Activity, advice must be sought from the Authorised Person on management of the bird. Injured Eastern Falcons or New Zealand Pipits may be euthanised on the recommendation of the Authorised Person or a veterinarian.

6. Incidental Discovery

- 6.1 The DOC Operations Manager for Whakatipu (queenstown@doc.govt.nz) is to be contacted immediately for further advice if protected wildlife other than those listed in Schedule 4 are located within the Site or within the release site. A separate application to catch alive, liberate or kill non-authorised species will be required.

7. Reporting

- 7.1 A report summarising the outcomes of any nest relocations must be submitted in writing to the DOC Operations Manager for Whakatipu (queenstown@doc.govt.nz) and [insert permissions email] by 30 June each year. All reporting must include:
 - (a) the project name;
 - (b) the species and number of any avifauna (or nests) collected and released;
 - (c) the GPS location (or detailed map) of the collection point(s) and release point(s);
 - (d) the results of all surveys, monitoring or research; and
 - (e) a description of how the relevant wildlife permit conditions were implemented, , including:
 - (i) any difficulties encountered with capture and handling;
 - (ii) how release sites were assessed;
 - (iii) post-release monitoring; and
 - (iv) what contingency actions (if any) were required.

- (f) The number and species of any species incidentally injured, euthanized or killed as part of the Authorised Activity.

8. Ownership of protected wildlife

- 8.1 All wildlife remains the property of the Crown. This includes any dead wildlife, live wildlife, any parts thereof, any eggs or progeny of the wildlife, genetic material and any replicated genetic material.
- 8.2 Unless expressly authorised by the Director-General in writing, the Wildlife Approval Holder must not donate, sell or otherwise transfer to any third party any wildlife collected or otherwise obtained under this approval.
