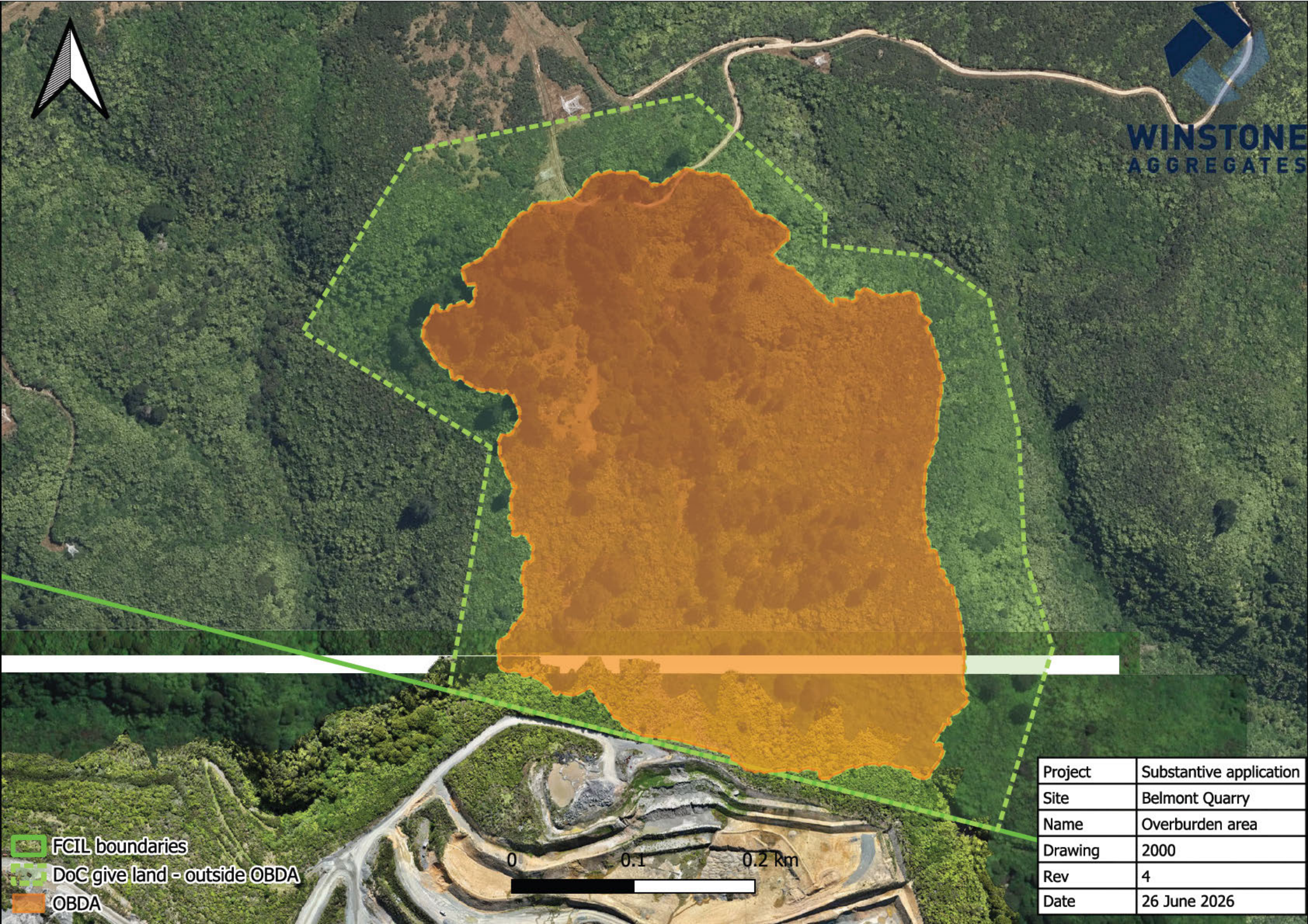

Kia ora Shalini,

Thank you for your email notifying Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga (HNZPT) of your intention to lodge a substantive application for Belmont Quarry (the project).

HNZPT has reviewed the archaeological assessment (Cameron, E 2026. Wellington Belmont Quarry, Proposed OBDA: Archaeological Assessment) which identifies one recorded archaeological site S27/910, a twentieth century farm building. As the farm building was constructed post 1900, it does not meet the definition of an archaeological site under the HNZPT Act 2014.

The assessment identifies that there is limited potential for archaeological remains associated with 19th century settlement within the project area including the potential subsurface remains of the 19th century tramway associated with timber felling. A more fulsome discussion of these potential features should be included in the archaeological assessment to meet the information requirements set out in Clause 2, Schedule 8 of the FTAA 2024.

HNZPT understands that you will be applying for an archaeological authority to provide for the modification or destruction of potential subsurface 19th century remains and have prepared a draft AMP and set of conditions. We will review and provide comment on these once the application has been submitted.

At the time of application, please provide a description of the consultation carried out with tangata whenua and landowners (the Department of Conservation and Hutt City Council), including the dates on which engagement occurred and the views expressed. You may reference supporting material such as email correspondence, Cultural Values Assessments, or minutes from meetings or site visits.

As requested during our hui, see below some of my comments I found relevant.

Regarding iwi involvement:

- Evidence of consultation will be provided with the substantial applicant,
- Ellen was able to meet with iwi representatives over teams, as an in-person meeting was not practical,
- Should any taonga be encountered during works, the appropriate place to store the taonga while works are ongoing will be decided by iwi,

Clarifications around the authority application

- The authority being applied for is proposed to be for a 15-year period. This is because the proposed overburden area is only required to be used when the market is suitable for quarry extraction,
- The management plan notes "HNZPT will be notified of significant archaeological features", with significant in this context relating to any identified pre-1900 material,

Action points for the applicant:

- Please provide additional information in the archaeological assessment around what features/sites may be encountered,
- Double check and ensure that the correct land parcels are being applied for.

As requested during our call two weeks ago, I'm sending through some of my preliminary comments prior to our hui on Wednesday.

My general comments/topics of discussion include:

- The assessment notes the potential to encounter unrecorded subsurface archaeology. However, it does not go into detail regarding what types of unrecorded archaeology may be encountered, such as artefacts, European rubbish pits, or archaeology associated with Māori occupation. I would like to discuss this to gain a better understanding on what archaeology may be encountered.
- The assessment discusses a management plan however this has not been provided for review. Additionally, it would be good to have a general discussion around the proposed earthworks and how this is meant to be managed with regard to archaeology.
- Has Emma had an opportunity to be introduced to the local iwi representatives? When providing our assessment for S45 approval, Darren and I are required to assess their cultural capability, including whether local iwi have had a chance to meet the proposed S45.
- No draft authority conditions have been provided. If a set of proposed draft conditions have been complied, please send them through for us to discuss.

Thanks for your message Shalini.

I have reflected on our phone conversation and read your explanation in this email below, and I can confirm that this arrangement is acceptable to Transpower and has not changed the original response position.

The access road identified in the original proposal was viewed as a “bonus” but is not a requirement for Transpower to be satisfied the land exchange and future development of an engineered landform will not result in effects that adversely impact the operation and maintenance of the National Grid.

The matters around planting height and management of ground levels in relation to the overhead conductors and line support structures, obviously still apply, as set out in our previous discussions.

Further to our discussion, I wanted to confirm our shared understanding regarding access requirements for the National Grid infrastructure within and adjacent to the Belmont Fast Track project area.

As discussed, Winstone's understanding is that a new access track is not currently required to facilitate Transpower's ongoing operation and maintenance activities. The existing upper Buchanan's Track is suitable for 4WD vehicle access and will continue to provide access to the transmission structures for routine maintenance purposes. This aligns with our previous discussions regarding access requirements.

Should it be determined in the future that a new or upgraded access track is required to accommodate heavy machinery or other maintenance activities, Winstone acknowledges that detailed design would be required. Any such access solution would need to be developed by Transpower or in close consultation with Transpower and designed in accordance with Transpower's operational requirements and technical specifications.

Winstone is committed to working collaboratively with Transpower to facilitate any future access requirements should they arise.

Could you please confirm that the above accurately reflects our discussion and Transpower's understanding of the proposed approach?

Thanks for getting in contact.

We are still happy with an approach that recognises that the final detail around the planting can be determined a later stage. We just need to ensure that the condition allows for detail to be agreed with

Transpower and that we do not find ourselves in a position where we cannot have input into the performance of the condition.

By way of example, we recently agreed on the below condition for a project that had similar needs, where deferred planting would be necessary for visual mitigation and habitat improvement, but was subject to an absolute maximum height restriction due to overhead lines.

- i. *records of engagement with Transpower NZ Ltd in relation to details of any planting restrictions within or adjacent to National Grid transmission corridors or support structures to ensure that the proposed planting within or adjacent to National Grid transmission corridors or support structures complies with the Electricity (Hazards from Trees) Regulations 2003, or any subsequent revision of the regulations, including details of how issues raised by Transpower NZ Ltd have been addressed or reasons why they are not addressed. For the avoidance of doubt, if there is any inconsistency between the requirements of the Mitigation Planting Plan (as appended) and the planting restrictions required by the Electricity (Hazards from Trees) Regulations 2003, or any subsequent revision of the regulations, the regulations must prevail;*

Transpower is very keen to continue working with Winstone to reach agreement on matters that will allow Transpower to have minimal involvement in the substantive process. If it is possible to review the part of the substantive application that relates to the National Grid, we would appreciate the opportunity to provide feedback.

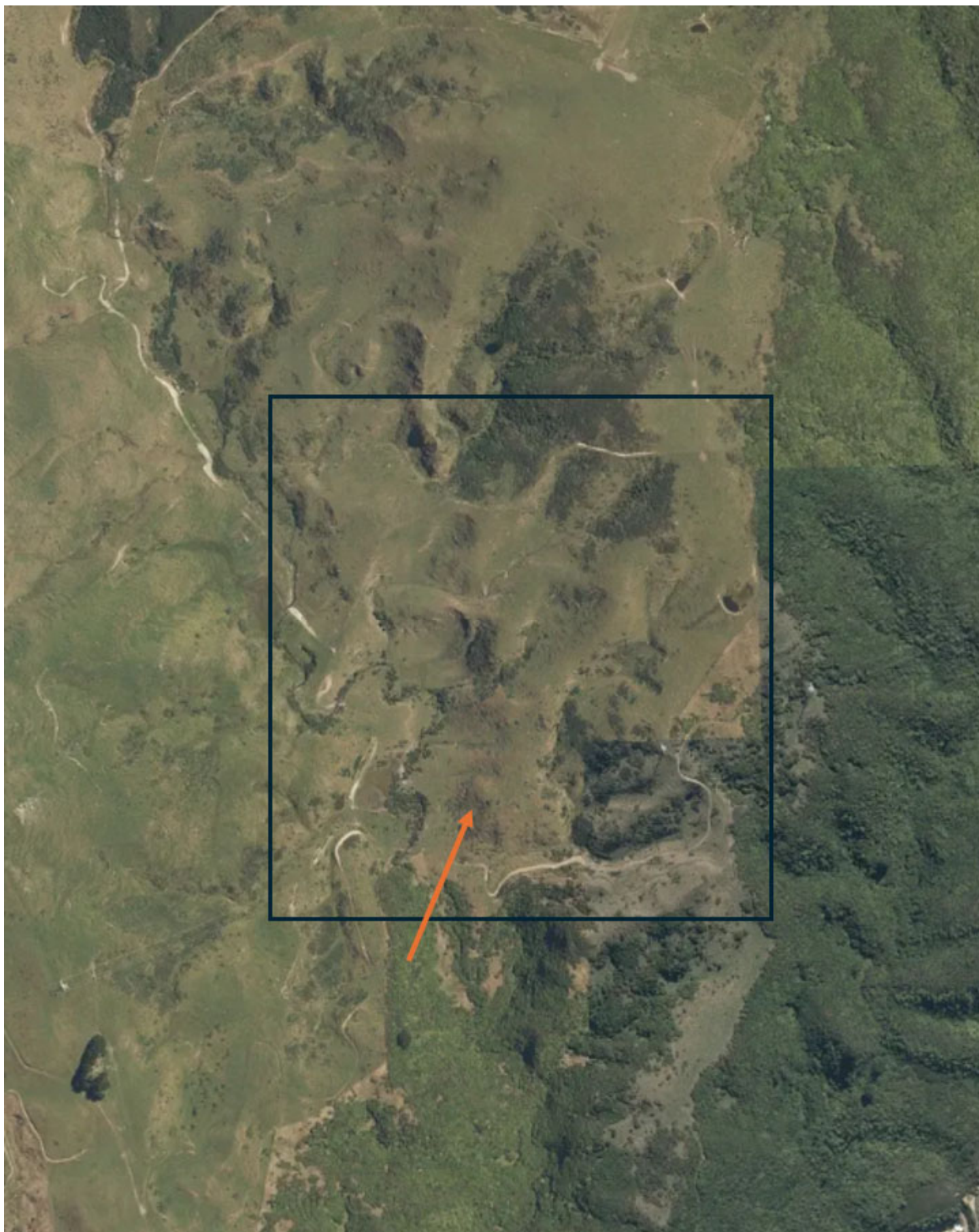

Hope you are well.

Following our discussions earlier this year, we have developed the landscape rehabilitation plan and refined the OBDA landform area. You will note that the design of the OBDA form has been designed to avoid any OBDA placement below the transmission lines. This comes as a response to our earlier conversations around ground level modification and replanting potentially encroaching on the within the transmission line safety zone.

As part of our full package of works, we are also seeking an offset location in the Belmont Regional Park 2 km west of the proposed OBDA development (see map). I note there is another transmission line which transverses the offset site in the lower half (see below). With respect to this particular area, the topography is undulating and the proposed planting will be staged across 5, 5 ha area across 25 years.



As the details on what this planting is will be determined later, we propose that as we discussed on 17 March 2026 that:

The final design of the offset planting and the condition requiring a management plan for the offset area have a trigger point for consultation with Transpower to ensure that transmission lines safety and operation requirements are met.

If you are happy with that approach we can add a condition to address this in the substantive application.

Also note this we intend to lodge the substantive application by end of July 2026. Please let me know whether this approach would address Transpower's concerns?

Thank you for your time before. Please find a summary of our discussion and the next steps.

- **Status of land exchange and substantive application:** Winstone provided an update on the progress on the application and to date and the next steps for the land exchange. The timeline for the final Director-General Report is yet to be determined.

The substantive application is progressing well with the intent to lodge the substantive as soon as the DG report on land exchange is received.

Andy confirmed for Transpower all matters identified within the land exchange remains relevant and unchanged for the substantive. Transpower prefers to continue engaging with Winstone's as the substantive application is prepared and how the proposed staging of works and final design will factor in Transpower's operational requirements.

- **Information request:** Transpower requested copy of the updated staging plans and landscape concepts plans for review. Shalini to provide by end of week.

- **Transpower Track:** Andy confirmed Transpower has no specific timing requirements for the new access track. The key need will be if heavy machinery is required to be brought to the site for pylon maintenance works. Otherwise the existing upper track provides 4WD access to the pylons for regular maintenance.
- **Consideration of final designs, management plans and conditions:** Certain height thresholds of the OBDA landform (both interim and final landform) may act as a trigger point for consultation with Transpower to ensure transmission line safety and operational requirements are met. Transpower wishes to understand what these may be (if any) and how this process will be managed

Thank you for your request for updated comments from NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA) in relation to the land exchange under sections 32–36 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (FTAA). NZTA provides this letter to confirm that it no longer has an informal interest in the area of land subject to the proposed land exchange. NZTA's position is set out below.

NZTA interests in the subject conservation land

NZTA previously advised that we have an informal interest in the area of conservation land that is subject to the proposed land exchange. This interest related to offset planting required as part of the State Highway 58 Safety Improvements Project (SH58). NZTA's designation conditions require planting to be undertaken within Belmont Regional Park to offset the removal of indigenous vegetation along the SH58 alignment. NZTA had previously proposed to undertake this offset planting within the area of conservation land subject to the land exchange, as shown in green in Attachment 1.

NZTA has since progressed an alternative location for the required offset planting within Belmont Regional Park. This alternative location is outside the area of land subject to the proposed land exchange.

Consultation

NZTA has worked with Greater Wellington Regional Council (GWRC) to identify suitable alternative offset planting location within Belmont Regional Park. NZTA is now finalising a contract with GWRC to undertake these works in the alternative location and is no longer reliant on the area of land subject to the proposed land exchange to fulfil its SH58 offset planting obligations.

NZTA has already obtained the necessary approvals from Hutt City Council (HCC) and Upper Hutt City Council (UHCC) for the offset planting to proceed at the alternative locations. Copies of those approvals in principle are appended to this letter as Attachment 2 and Attachment 3.

Resolution on NZ Transport Agency Interests

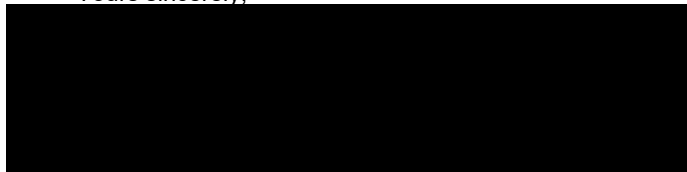
Given the above, NZTA can now confirm that it no longer has an informal interest in the area of land subject to the proposed land exchange. NZTA's previous informal interest was limited to the potential use of that area for SH58 offset planting. As NZTA is proceeding with alternative offset planting locations within Belmont Regional Park and has obtained approval in

principle from both HCC and UHCC for those alternative locations, NZTA no longer requires access to, or use of, the proposed land exchange area for that purpose.

For completeness, this letter is limited to confirming NZTA's current position in relation to its previous informal interest in the land subject to the proposed land exchange. It does not constitute NZTA's comments on the substantive FTAA application. NZTA will provide comments on that application if invited to do so by the expert panel in due course.

I am the Project Planner on the State Highway 58 Project, and I am trying to progress the requirements of Designation TN4 - Conditions 4.1 - 4.3. I am requesting the Hutt City Council's position on our request in the attached letter regarding our approach to complying with these conditions.

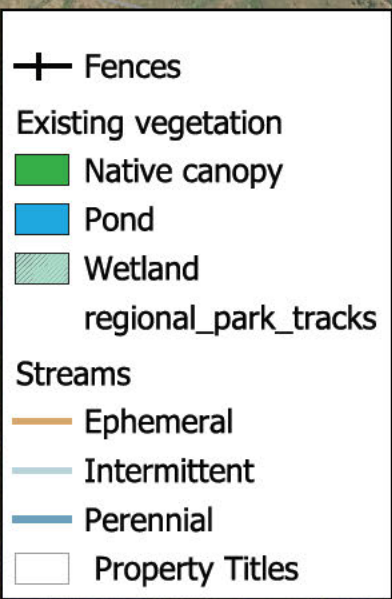

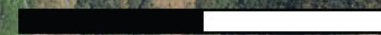

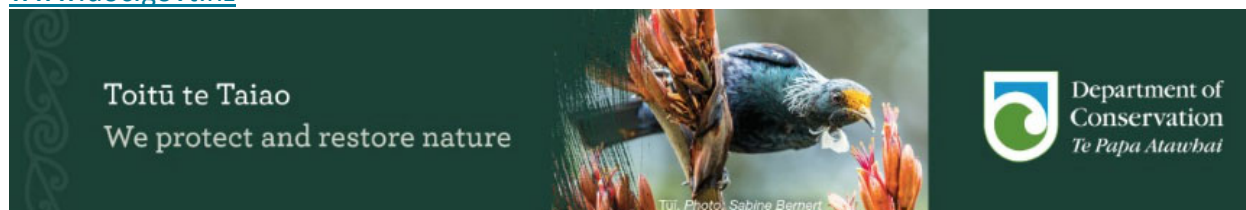

I am writing to provide a short update on the Belmont Quarry Development, which includes the development of a new overburden area immediately north of the quarry.

As you may recall, last year we wrote to you regarding a proposed land exchange associated with the future development of Belmont Quarry. The land exchange forms part of a broader project to support the long-term operation of the quarry and maintain a local supply of aggregates for the Wellington region.

Belmont Quarry has supplied aggregates to the Hutt Valley and Wellington region for more than 100 years. These materials are essential for roads, housing, public infrastructure and concrete construction.

Since we first with you with you on the proposal, we have continued to refine the project in response to community feedback and technical investigations. This has included, where possible, changes to avoid areas where threatened native plants and wetlands are present, along with further work to understand and manage potential environmental effects.

As part of the project, Winstone Aggregates applied to the Department of Conservation for a proposed land exchange involving a small area of Belmont Regional Park in exchange for land owned by Fletcher Concrete and Infrastructure (FCIL), Winstone Aggregates' parent company. On 7 July, DOC provided its report on the proposed land exchange.

With this stage now complete, we are finalising our substantive Fast track application for the proposed new overburden area at Belmont Quarry. The application is supported by a range of technical assessments, including ecology, noise, dust, hydrology, erosion and sediment control, landscape and rehabilitation. These reports will be publicly available when the application is lodged in late July.

Two maps associated with the project have been attached for your reference.

- Map A: Shows the land exchange components.
- Map B: Shows the proposed overburden location with respect to the existing quarry.

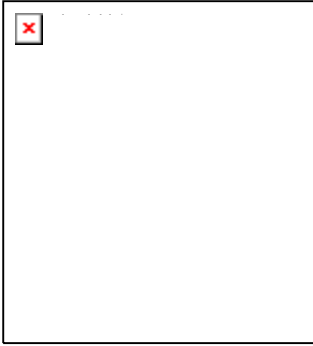

1.0	Outline
1.1	The purpose of the meeting was to: - Hear the views of the Friends group directly - Seek to better understand their concerns and perspectives - Clarify aspects of the proposal and the broader consenting process - Seek views on the improvements package offered as part of the land exchange and whether there was anything Friends would like to add. - Identify any additional considerations which Winstone need to assess as part of the substantive application - Identify opportunities where we could work together & invite the Friends group to walk over the proposed DoC give areas. Winstone also thanked Friends for their submission and correspondence to date.
2.0	Swamp maire and access
2.1	Johnathan questioned the reason for, and the need to, plant approximately 200 swamp maire. - Winstone advised that, if the land exchange proceeded, the proposed planting would significantly increase the population of swamp maire within the regional park and the wider region. - Friends expressed that the 200 swamp maire plants had “no value in the southern gully” and stated these plants were better off in a nursery condition than being planted in the southern gully. Concern was expressed that the proposed planting locations Southern Gully would be too far away or inaccessible and will not provide protection for these plants.
2.2	Friends expressed that: - Swamp maire are fragile and sensitive plants. - Public access and the ability to view the plants from a safe distance are important and viewing is currently achievable via the Buchannon’s Track.
2.3	Friends acknowledged that Winstone Aggregates drew attention to the presence of swamp maire. The group became aware of swamp maire in February 2025 because of the land exchange proposal.
3.0	Ecology and fragmentation
3.1	Friends raised concerns that the proposal would: Degrade ecological values,

	• Increase the risk of weed invasion and • Further fragment the park environment.
3.2	Anthony confirmed that opposition to the proposal relates to a number of matters including: • Walking track access, • Swamp maire and the ability to access these plants, provide public viewpoints and maintenance, • Removal of a “perched” wetland and landscape features, • Ecological fragmentation more broadly and possibility of pest incursion into the park. Friends emphasised that these matters should be considered collectively rather than in isolation.
4.0	Northern Gully
4.1	Friends stated that they consider the Northern Gully to have limited value under the land exchange, primarily due to perceived access limitations.
4.2	Winstone invited the Friends group to undertake a site walkover of the Winstone sites, being the Southern Gully which has habitat for future swamp maire planting and a wetland. • Friends expressed interest in walking the top of the “Firth block” but advised this would need to be discussed with members. • Winstone noted that any site visit would need to be planned with appropriate health and safety management and accompanied by a project team member. Friends to confirm details of the walking route, number of participants and areas they wish to see including date and time. Once provided, Winstone will facilitate the logistics on site.
5.0	Consenting process and submission
5.1	Winstone thanked the Friends group for their detailed submission, including their time and effort to pull together the level of information presented. Winstone clarified that: • Much of the feedback relates to the substantive application stage of the consenting process. • The Friends group will have an opportunity to review and comment on draft conditions offered by the applicant during that stage.
5.2	Friends questioned whether they could see Winstone’s comments on DoC’s Report. It was clarified all formal correspondence and Winstone’s comments on the DoC Report will be available online on the Fast Track website.
6.0	Rehabilitation, pest control and past performances
6.1	Friends raised concerns regarding past rehabilitation outcomes, particularly at Dry Creek, and Winstone’s broader approach to rehabilitation planting and pest control. Winstone acknowledged that rehabilitation outcomes at Dry Creek could be improved and noted opportunities for ongoing site management. Winstone to provide Friends copies of their Environmental Policy and Sustainability Policy.
7.0	Technical report
7.1	Winstone offered to provide relevant sections of technical and environmental reports. • The Friends group agreed to confirm what information they would like to review in the land exchange application.
8.0	Improvements package
8.1	Winstone sought Friends input into the improvements package offered as part of the land exchange and questioned whether there was anything Winstone’s assessment missed (or should consider as part of the substantive). The friends pointed out that:

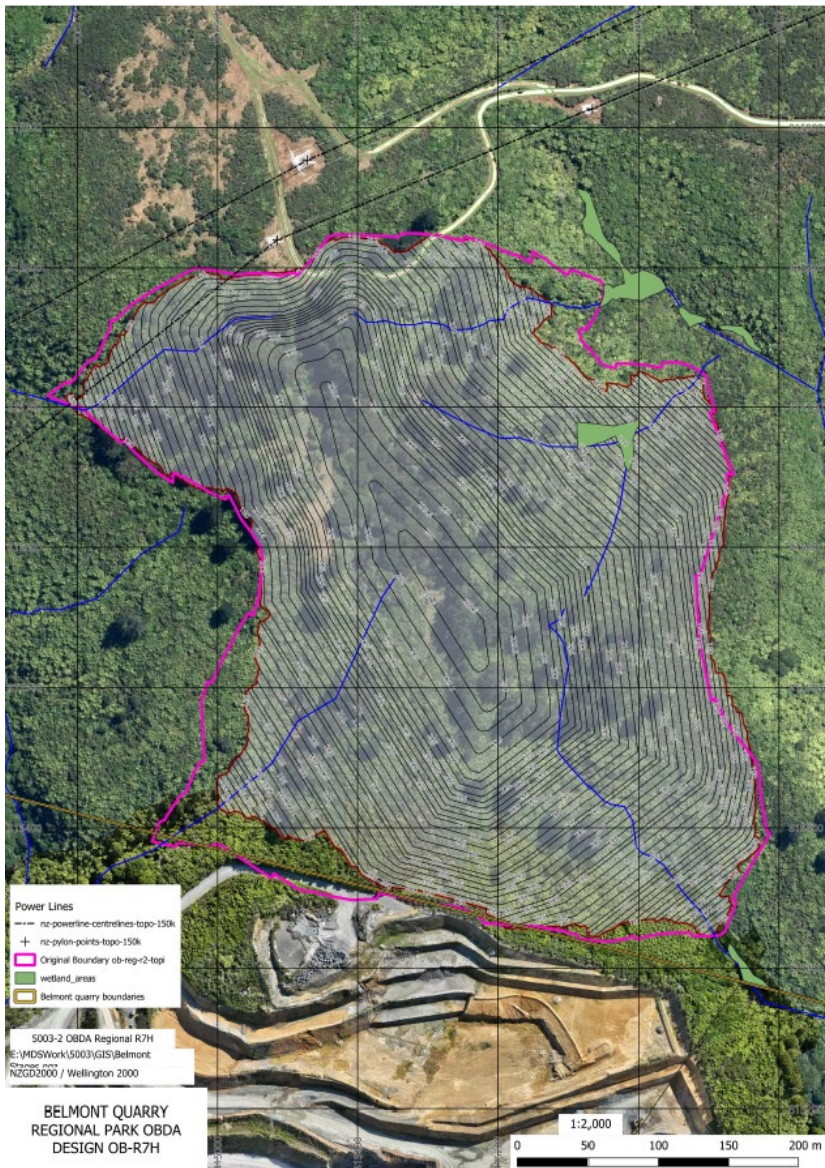
	Their members had not convened to discuss mitigation and the packaged offered as part of the land exchange. Noting the group will need to discuss internally and come back. Friends stated that, in their view, no mitigation could offset the loss of park land, recreational access, regenerating forest or limitations on public access to swamp maire.
9.0	Previous assessments
9.1	Questions were raised regarding the Boffa Ecology Report (2017), particularly its findings and documentation in relation to swamp maire. This report was not submitted as part of a formal application, however Winstone is happy to provide a summary of its findings to the Friends group.
10.0	Overall position
10.1	Friends stated that they remain opposed to the proposal in principle, including the land exchange and associated loss of park land, recreational access and ecological values. Friends expressed a strong view that: - The quarry to remain within its current land holdings, and - Quarrying activity ceases within approximately ten years, with business seeking relocation operations elsewhere.

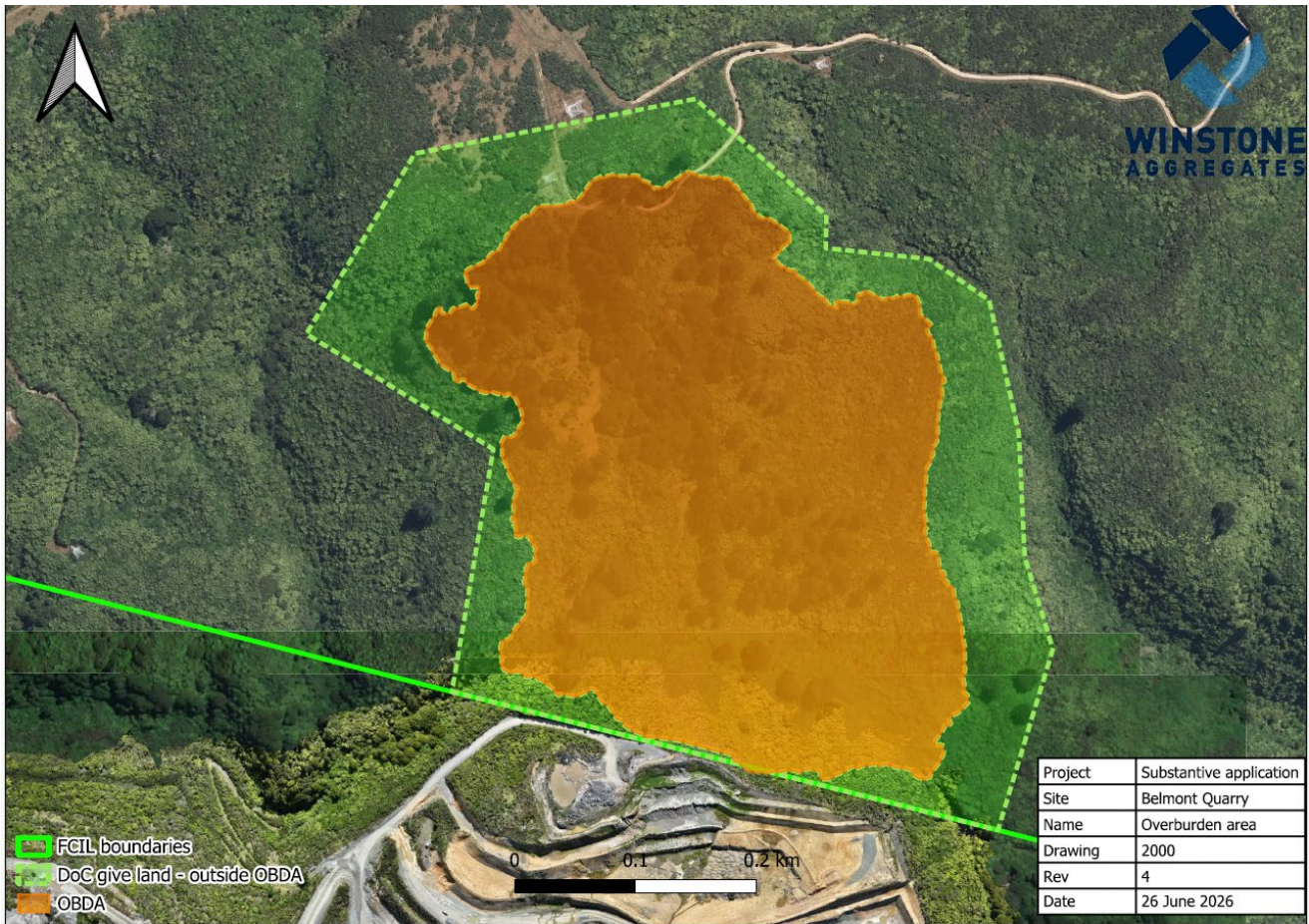
