1.2	Where obligations bind more than one person, those obligations bind those persons jointly and separately.
2. AUTHORISATION	
2.1	The Approval Holder is only allowed to carry out the Authorised Activity in the Land described in Schedule 1, Item 3.
2.2	Any arrangements necessary for access over private land or leased land are the responsibility of the Approval Holder.
2.3	The Approval Holder and Authorised Personnel must carry a copy of this Authority with them at all times while carrying out the Authorised Activity.
2.4	The Approval Holder may publish authorised research results.
2.5	The Approval Holder must immediately notify the Department of any taxa found which are new to science. In addition, the Approval Holder must lodge holotype specimens and a voucher specimen of any new taxa with a recognised national collection.
3. PARTIES AUTHORISED	
3.1	Only the Approval Holder and the Authorised Personnel described in Schedule 1 are authorised to carry out the Authorised Activity, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Department.
4. TERM	
4.1	This Approval commences and ends on the dates set out in Schedule 1, Item 7 .
5. COMPLIANCE WITH LEGISLATION AND THE DEPARTMENT'S NOTICES AND DIRECTIONS	
5.1	The Approval Holder must comply with all statutes, bylaws, and regulations relevant to the exercise of the Approval, and all notices, directions, and requisitions of the Director-General.
6. TERMINATION	
6.1	The Director-General may revoke this Approval at any time in respect of the whole or any part (pursuant to clause 7(4) of Schedule 7 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 if: <ul style="list-style-type: none">a. the Approval Holder breaches any of the conditions of this Approval; orb. in the Director-General's opinion, the carrying out of the Authorised Activity causes or is likely to cause any unforeseen or unacceptable effects on avifauna.
6.2	If the Director-General intends to terminate this Approval in whole or in part, the Director-General must give the Approval Holder such prior notice as, in the sole opinion of the Department, appears reasonable and necessary in the circumstances.

7. SENDING AND RECEIPT OF NOTICES	
7.1	Any notice to be given under this Approval by the Department is to be in writing and made by personal delivery, by pre-paid post or email to the Approval Holder at the address, fax number or email address specified in Schedule 1, Item 8. Any such notice is to be deemed to have been received: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. in the case of personal delivery, on the date of delivery; b. in the case of post, on the third working day after posting; c. in the case of email, on the date receipt of the email is acknowledged by the addressee by return email or otherwise in writing.
7.2	If the Approval Holder's details specified in Schedule 1, Item 8 change then the Approval Holder must notify the Department within 5 working days of such change.
8. PAYMENT OF COSTS	
8.1	The Approval Holder must pay the standard Department charge-out rates for any staff time and mileage required to monitor compliance with this Approval and to investigate any alleged breaches of the terms and conditions of it.
9. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

COMPLIANCE WITH AMP	
1.	The Authorised Activity must be undertaken in accordance with an approved AMP listed in Schedule 1 Item 1C , except when otherwise instructed by the Department.
2.	This Approval applies only where: <ul style="list-style-type: none">a. mortality is incidental, andb. all reasonable measures to avoid, remedy, or mitigate effects on avifauna have been implemented in accordance with the AMP attached in Schedule 5.
AMP CERTIFICATION, REVIEW AND AMENDMENT PROCESS	
3.	The AMP shall be prepared and signed off by Authorised Personnel, follow best practice in terms of hygiene and animal welfare, and include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">a. identification of the ecological values of the Land for avifauna;b. identification of potential effects of the Project Works on avifauna;c. protocols for managing and responding to incidental discovery of dead or injured Threatened and At Risk indigenous birds which must be in general accordance with the incidental discovery protocol set out in section 6.11 of the Draft Avifauna Management Plan; andd. an Avifauna Carcass Monitoring Programme, which must be in general accordance with the requirements of section 6.14 of the Draft Avifauna Management Plan.
4.	At least 20 Working Days before starting Project Works, the AMP shall be provided to DOC for certification that the AMP satisfies the requirements of Schedule 3 Condition 3.
<i>Advice note: approval of the AMP shall only relate to the parts of the AMP that have been prepared for the purpose of this Wildlife Act Approval, as identified in the AMP. Other parts of the AMP address matters that are required by resource consent conditions and will be certified by Mackenzie District Council.</i>	
5.	The Approval Holder must implement and comply with the certified AMP for the duration of the Project.
6.	The Approval Holder must review the AMP and resubmit it to the Department for certification before the expiry of the Approval, if it intends to seek to extend the term of the Approval. The objective of the review is to re-assess habitat conditions and characteristics and update the AMP to reflect current species knowledge, best practice avifauna management and mitigation techniques.
7.	The Approval Holder may make amendments to the AMP at any time. Any amendment to those plans must be submitted for recertification by the Department Manager and any works associated with the amendment must not commence until recertification has occurred.
<i>Advice note: The application documents contain a draft AMP which will be finalised through the above conditions.</i>	
OWNERSHIP AND HOLDING OF ABSOLUTELY PROTECTED WILDLIFE	
8.	This Approval gives the Approval Holder the right to hold absolutely protected wildlife in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Approval, but the wildlife remains the property of the Crown.

9.	Unless expressly authorised by the Department in writing, the Approval Holder must not donate, sell or otherwise transfer to any third party any wildlife, material, including any genetic material, or any material propagated or cloned from such material, collected under this Approval.
DISCOVERY, ASSESSMENT AND STORAGE	
10.	Dead bird specimens must only be handled by Authorised Personnel listed in Schedule 1 Item x, or under the direct supervision of the Authorised Personnel.
11.	Dead bird specimens must be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. securely stored at a Storage Location to prevent loss, theft, or degradation; and b. labelled with species, date, location of collection, and cause of death (where known).
12.	Species identification shall be undertaken by Authorised Personnel or a Department Officer. If the carcass cannot be identified to species level, swabs must be taken for DNA identification.
13.	If the cause of fatality of a bird cannot be determined, then where requested by the Department, the Approval Holder must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. transport specimens to a nominated facility (e.g. Massey University Wildlife Post-mortem Service); b. bear reasonable costs associated with necropsy or investigation; and c. provide results to the Department upon receipt.
14.	Authorised Department officers may inspect the following at any reasonable time: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. specimens; b. storage facilities; and c. registers and records.
15.	Appropriate hygiene, biosecurity, and disease-control procedures must be followed at all times.
16.	If required in writing by the Department, the Approval Holder must make such improvements to techniques (including handling and storing), and take such other steps as directed by the Department.
NOTIFICATION	
17.	The Approval Holder must notify the Department: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. within 48 hours of any incident involving the death of Threatened or At Risk avifauna; and b. immediately where: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. multiple birds are killed; ii. a Threatened species is involved; or iii. mortality indicates a systemic failure of mitigation.
REPORTING	
18.	The Approval Holder must provide an annual report to the Department on any carcass monitoring surveys, gathering and storage of birds undertaken. These must be electronically forwarded to the Department at [DOC email address] and citing the Approval number. These reports must be submitted by 30 June each year.

19.	<p>A report summarising the outcomes of investigation of bird deaths must be submitted in writing to [DOC email address] within three months of the investigation being completed.</p> <p>Each report must include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. the Approval number; b. the species and number of any animals collected; c. the GPS location (or a detailed map) of the collection point(s); d. the results of any surveys, monitoring or research; and e. disposal methods and locations.
DISPOSAL

2.3	The Approval Holder must advise the Department's local Operations Manager(s) one week prior to carrying out the Authorised Activity in the District, when the Approval Holder intends to carry out the Authorised Activity.
2.4	The Approval Holder and Authorised Personnel must carry a copy of this Authority with them at all times while carrying out the Authorised Activity.
2.5	The Approval Holder may publish authorised research results.
2.6	The Approval Holder must immediately notify the Department of any taxa found which are new to science. In addition, the Authority Holder must lodge holotype specimens and a voucher specimen of any new taxa with a recognised national collection.
3. PARTIES AUTHORISED

COMPLIANCE WITH LMP	
1.	The Authorised Activity must be carried out in accordance with an approved Lizard Management Plan listed in Schedule 1 Item 1B, except when instructed otherwise by the Department.
LMP CERTIFICATION AND REVIEW PROCESS	
2.	<p>The LMP must be prepared and signed off by Approved Personnel, follow best practice in terms of hygiene and animal welfare, and include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a. Protocols for:<ul style="list-style-type: none">i. hygiene (Lizard disease) protocols to minimise the risk of disease transmission;ii. incidental discovery of unexpected threatened lizard species;iii. currently accepted best practice protocols to minimise the risk of injury or death to lizards during lizard management;iv. incidental death associated with salvage; andv. incidental discovery of lizards on the Land.b. Measures for the creation and enhancement of Lizard habitat within the Release Area; andc. Post-release monitoring and reporting requirements.
3.	At least 20 Working Days before starting Project Works, the LMP must be provided to DOC for certification that the LMP satisfies the requirements of Schedule 3 Condition 2.
Advice Note: Certification of the LMP shall only relate to the parts of the LMP that have been prepared for the purpose of this Wildlife Act Approval, as identified in the LMP. Other parts of the LMP address matters that are required by resource consent conditions and will be certified by Mackenzie District Council.	
4.	The Approval Holder must implement and comply with the certified LMP for the duration of Project Works.
5.	The Approval Holder must review the LMP and resubmit it to the Department for certification before the expiry of the Approval, if it intends to seek to extend the term of the Approval. The objective of the review is to re-assess habitat conditions and characteristics and update the LMP to reflect current species knowledge, best practice lizard management and mitigation techniques.

LIZARD HABITAT ENHANCEMENT AND INCIDENTAL SALVAGE AND RELOCATION	
6.	The Approval Holder must undertake habitat enhancement as set out in the LMP to ensure adequate mitigation of effects has been achieved

7.	<p>A report summarising any lizard incidental discoveries and capture and relocation activities must be prepared and submitted to the Department ([x]@doc.govt.nz and permissionshamilton@doc.govt.nz) by 30 June each year. Specifically, this report is to include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Results of any lizard capture and relocation work. Should native lizards be found, then the following will also be included in the report: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. photos of lizards captured (including photos of the capture and relocation areas); ii. a map showing the location of lizard upon capture and upon release; iii. the species and number of any lizards detected, captured, and released; iv. the results of all surveys and monitoring; v. descriptions of how any lizard management activities outlined in the LMP and relevant conditions detailed in the wildlife approval and associated resource consent conditions were followed; vi. an Amphibian and Reptile Distribution Scheme (ARDS) card detailing information relating to captured lizards (also to be provided to herpetofauna@doc.govt.nz); and vii. a brief summary regarding the outcomes of the LMP, including any improvements/changes that should be implemented in future.
LIZARD CAPTURE AND HANDLING	
8.	Lizards must only be handled by Authorised Personnel, or under the direct supervision of the Authorised Personnel.
9.	Capture and handling methods must involve only techniques that minimise the risk of infection or injury to the animal and must follow those described in the Herpetofauna inventory and monitoring toolbox http://www.doc.govt.nz/ourwork/biodiversity-inventory-and-monitoring/herpetofauna/ .
10.	The Department Operations Manager for [x] must be contacted immediately (email) by the Authorised Personnel for further advice if lizard species that are not covered by this Approval are located within the footprint of the development or within the Release Area.
OWNERSHIP AND HOLDING OF ABSOLUTELY PROTECTED WILDLIFE	
11.	This Approval gives the Approval Holder the right to hold absolutely protected wildlife for no longer than 12 hours in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Approval, but the wildlife remains the property of the Crown. This includes any dead wildlife, live wildlife, any parts thereof, any eggs or progeny of the wildlife, genetic material and any replicated genetic material.
12.	Unless expressly authorised by the Department in writing, the Approval Holder must not donate, sell or otherwise transfer to any third party any wildlife, material, including any genetic material, or any material propagated or cloned from such material, collected under this Approval.
DEATH OF WILDLIFE ASSOCIATED WITH ACTIVITIES COVERED BY THE AUTHORITY	
13.	If, in the course undertaking the Authorised Activities, all reasonable effort has been made to meet all of the conditions expressed and implied in this Approval; and wildlife is killed by the Approval Holder, then that will be permitted under this Approval.

14.	<p>If any lizards are found dead during the Authorised Activities, the Approval Holder must contact the Department's [x] Office on [0800 275 362] within 48 hours and follow the instructions of the Manager. This may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) chilling the body if it can be delivered within 72 hours, or freeze the body if delivery will take longer than 72 hours; and (ii) sending the body to Massey University Wildlife Postmortem Service for necropsy or as otherwise advised by the [x] Department Operations Manager, along with details of the animal's history; (iii) paying for any costs incurred in investigation of the death of any lizard; (iv) ceasing the Approved Activity within the Potential Lizard Habitat for a period determined by the Department Operations Manager.
EUTHANASIA	
15.	<p>If any lizards are found injured, Authorised Personnel must be contacted to get advice on management of the lizard. Injured lizard(s) may be euthanised on recommendation of Authorised Personnel or a veterinarian.</p>
RECORDS	
16.	<p>All survey, salvage and release records must be made available for inspection at reasonable times by officers of the Department.</p>
LIZARD SALVAGE REPORTING	
17.	<p>A report summarising any lizard incidental discoveries and capture and relocation activities must be prepared and submitted to DOC ([x]@doc.govt.nz and permissionshamilton@doc.govt.nz) by 30 June each year. Specifically, this report is to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. results of any lizard capture and relocation work. Should native lizards be found, then the following will also be included in the report: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. photos of lizards captured (including photos of the capture and relocation areas); ii. a map showing the location of lizard upon capture and upon release; iii. the species and number of any lizards detected, captured, and released; iv. the results of all surveys and monitoring; v. descriptions of how any lizard management activities outlined in the LMP and relevant conditions detailed in the wildlife approval and associated resource consent conditions were followed; vi. an Amphibian and Reptile Distribution Scheme (ARDS) card detailing information relating to captured lizards (also to be provided to herpetofauna@doc.govt.nz); and vii. a brief summary regarding the outcomes of the LMP, including any improvements/changes that should be implemented in future.
