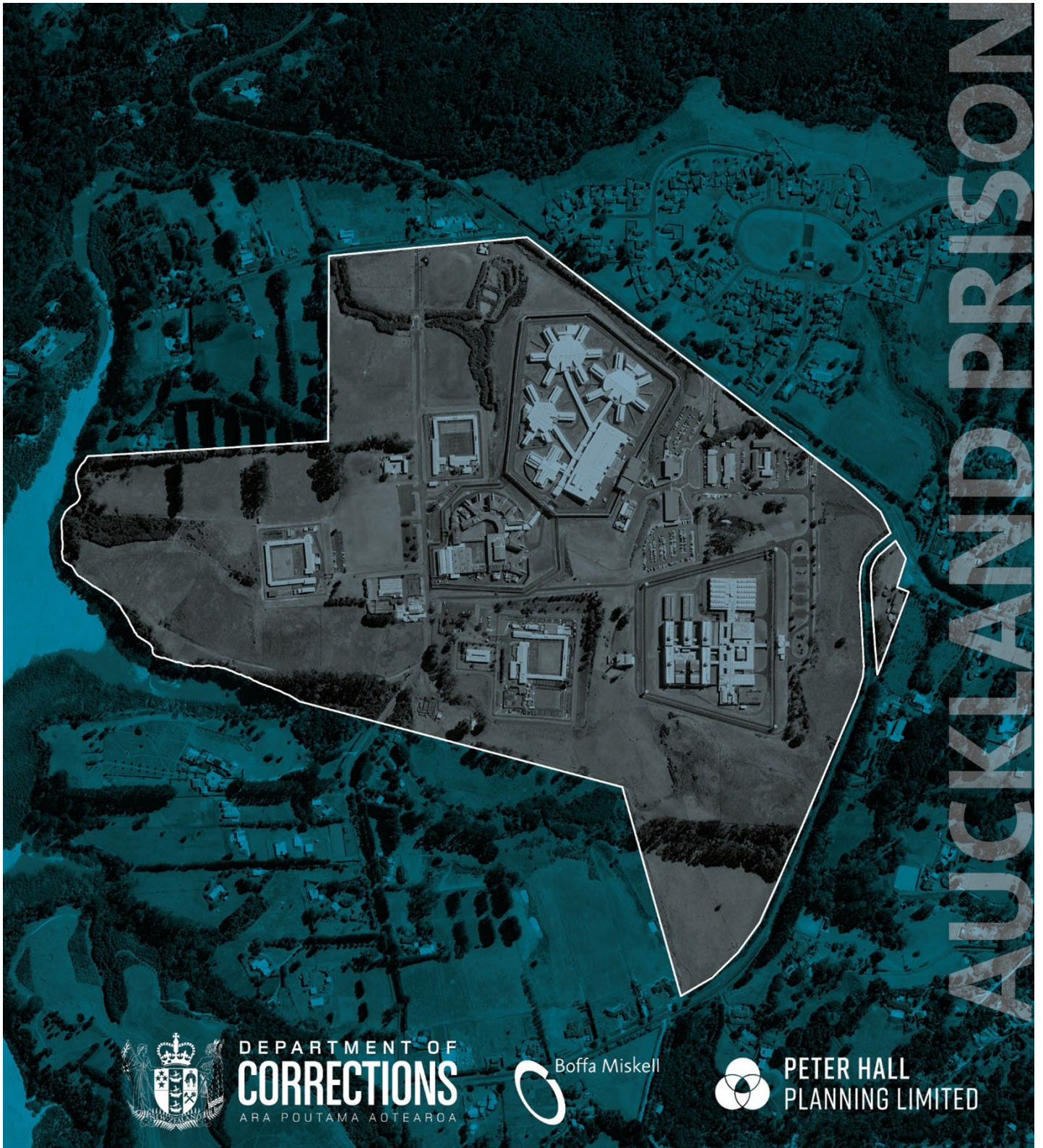

| AA01 | The authority holder must ensure that all contractors working on the project are briefed on site by the s45 (Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014) approved person (<i>approved person</i>), who may appoint a person to carry out the briefing on their behalf, prior to any works commencing on the possibility of encountering archaeological evidence, how to identify possible archaeological sites during works, the archaeological work required by the conditions of this authority, and contractors' responsibilities with regard to notification of the discovery of archaeological evidence to ensure that the authority conditions are complied with. |
| AA02 | Prior to the start of any on-site archaeological work, the authority holder must ensure that Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga is advised of the date when work will begin. This advice must be provided at least 2 working days before on-site archaeological work starts. The authority holder must also ensure that Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga is advised of the completion of on-site archaeological work, within 5 working days of completion. |
| AA03 | The authority must be exercised in accordance with the Archaeological Management Plan (March 2026) attached to the authority application and any changes to the plan require the prior written agreement of Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga. |
| AA04 | Works that may affect archaeological sites in the "Areas where archaeological monitoring is required" shown in Figure A: Site Plan for Archaeological Authority must be monitored by the approved person. The approved person may appoint a person to carry out monitoring on their behalf and in accordance with the Archaeological Management Plan referred to in Condition AA03. |
| AA05 | Any sensitive material encountered during the exercise of this authority must be investigated, recorded and analysed in accordance with accepted professional archaeological standards in accordance with the New Zealand Archaeological Association Code of Ethics. |

| <p>AA06</p> | <p>In addition to Conditions AA03 and AA04 and any tikanga agreed to between the authority holder, Relevant Iwi provided with the authority application, the following shall apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Access for Relevant Iwi shall be enabled in order to undertake tikanga consistent with any requirements of site safety; (b) Relevant Iwi shall be informed 48 hours before the start and finish of the archaeological work; (c) If any kōiwi (human remains) are encountered, all work should cease within 5 metres of the discovery. The Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Senior Archaeologist, New Zealand Police, Relevant Iwi must be advised immediately in accordance with Guidelines for Kōiwi Tangata/Human Remains (AGS8 2010) and no further work in the area may take place until future actions have been agreed by all parties; (d) Relevant Iwi shall be informed if any possible taonga or Māori artefacts are identified to enable appropriate tikanga to be undertaken, so long as all statutory requirements under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014 and the Protected Objects Act 1975 are met; and (e) Relevant Iwi shall be provided with a copy of any reports completed as a result of the archaeological work associated with this authority and be given an opportunity to discuss it with the approved person if required. <p>For the purposes of this condition Relevant Iwi are identified as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Te Kawerau ā Maki; • Ngāti Whātua o Kaipara; • Ngaati Whanaunga; and • Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua. |
| <p>AA07</p> | <p>Within 20 working days of the completion of the on-site archaeological work for each stage of construction work associated with this authority, the authority holder shall ensure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) An interim report following the Archaeological Report Guideline (AGS12 2023) is submitted to the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Senior Archaeologist for inclusion in the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Archaeological Reports Digital Library; and (b) Site record forms are updated or submitted to the NZAA Site Recording Scheme. |
| <p>AA08</p> | <p>That within 12 months of the completion of all stages of the on-site archaeological work, the authority holder shall ensure that a final report, completed following the Archaeological Report Guideline (AGS12 2023), is submitted to the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Senior Archaeologist for inclusion in the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Archaeological Reports Digital Library.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) One hard copy and one digital copy of the final report are to be sent to the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Senior Archaeologist; and (b) Digital copies of the final report must also be sent to the NZAA Central Filekeeper, Auckland Council CHI, Auckland War Memorial Museum and relevant Iwi. |
