We understand that pre-application meetings are not currently being offered, and we are happy to proceed on that basis.

As requested, we have provided the following overview of the proposal to support written engagement ahead of lodgement of the Substantive Application under section 29 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024.

Arataki Project - Substantive Application

Applicant: CDL Land NZ Limited

Location: 86, 108 and 122 Arataki Road, Havelock North

Project Overview

The Arataki Project is a proposed comprehensive residential subdivision and development of 171 lots (average lot size ~450m²) located at the eastern extent of the existing Havelock North urban area. The site is currently zoned Plains Production Zone but is earmarked for future urban development. The proposal aims to deliver a well-integrated neighbourhood supported by necessary public infrastructure.

Key components include:

- Two lot types supported by a Residential Development Framework (RDF) in lieu of urban zoning
- · Landscaped buffer and building setback adjacent to the rural boundary

- A ~9,000m² dry stormwater attenuation basin
- Primary and secondary stormwater discharges to an existing watercourse and the HDC reticulated system
- Stormwater treatment through raingardens, proprietary devices, and polishing via the basin
- New roading network connected to Arataki Road
- "Green Street" corridor providing stormwater linkages and public amenity
- "Play along the way" activity spaces

Resource Consents Sought

Resource consents are required under the Hawkes Bay Regional Plan and Hastings District Plan as follows:

- Land use consent
- Subdivision consent
- Discharge consent stormwater
- Stream works consent (structure within 10 m of stream extent)
- Discharge consent contamination (associated with legacy residential activities and historic on-site burn piles)

No other approvals are required under the HNZPT or Wildlife Act.

Council Engagement

Engagement with Hastings District Council (HDC) and Hawke's Bay Regional Council (HBRC) has been ongoing throughout the preparation of the Arataki Project application.

- HDC: Regular engagement has occurred with HDC officers across key disciplines, including planning, engineering, transportation, parks, and stormwater. Draft technical reports have been shared with HDC for review and feedback. Final technical reports and proposed consent conditions are being provided to HDC this month to enable final comment prior to lodgement. Feedback to date has been constructive and is being incorporated into the application material.
- **HBRC**: Engagement with HBRC has focused on stormwater management, discharge consents, and water quality outcomes. Technical reports will be provided to HBRC this week for review and feedback.

Mana Whenua Engagement

Mana whenua engagement has included the following:

- Engagement facilitated via Tamatea Pōkai Whenua (TPW), with outreach to relevant hapū
 - o In response to hapū feedback, the proposal has been amended as follows:
 - o Stormwater design enhanced to improve water quality treatment
 - o Commitment to post-development water quality monitoring
 - Accidental Discovery Protocols to be implemented
 - Landscape planting revised to reflect local context and preferred species

Neighbour Engagement

Targeted engagement has been undertaken with adjacent landowners and residents to inform them of the project and receive feedback:

- Brookvale Road neighbours: Direct engagement was held with neighbours immediate to the stormwater device who had raised concerns regarding flooding and potential downstream effects. A constructive meeting was held to explain the stormwater design and modelling outcomes. The project team has committed to assisting these neighbours in further discussions with HDC regarding existing flooding issues in the wider catchment.
- General residential neighbours: A summary letter and plan was provided to immediately adjacent residential neighbours for comment. A number of concerns have been raised by adjacent neighbours including density, traffic, amenity and character, social concerns, and open space provision.
- Rural neighbours: Feedback provided from adjoining rural landowners relating to concerns around reverse sensitivity effects (in relation to spray drift and noise primarily).

A Consultation Report is being finalised and will be included with the application, summarising all neighbour feedback received and the project's responses to this input. The project team is working through the feedback provided and determining whether any design amendments are required to address concerns.

Next Steps

Next steps for the project include:

- Application preparation nearing completion with final technical reports underway.
- · Engagement and consultation processes to be closed out.
- Application lodgement with the EPA targeted for July 2025

We have attached the PowerPoint presentation shared with HDC and HBRC to support this summary. We trust that this and the above provide a good understanding of the Arataki Project and proposed application. We look forward to hearing back from you.

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Arataki Project – Pre-lodgement consultation under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (FTAA)

Thank you for your correspondence dated 11 June 2025 in relation to CDL Land NZ Limited's intention to lodge a substantive application for a listed project under the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (FTAA) in respect of the "Arataki" project.

As you are aware, the Ministry for the Environment (the Ministry) is the "relevant administering agency" for approvals relating to the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) and Exclusive Economic Zone and Continental Shelf (Environmental Effects) Act 2012 (EEZ Act) under the FTAA.

We have received the information you provided on 11 June 2025. As part of your substantive application, you will need to provide an assessment of the project against any relevant national policy statement, national environmental standards and if relevant the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement. The Ministry has prepared the following summary on the national direction made under the RMA, for your consideration.

National Direction

Under the RMA, the government can create national direction to support local authorities' decision making under the RMA and develop a nationally consistent approach to resource management issues. This is typically done where an issue is of national importance, or involves significant national benefits or costs, or where necessary to give effect to other government policy or regulation. There are several types of national direction, including national policy statements and national environmental standards.

National Policy Statements (NPS)

National Policy Statements are instruments issued under section 52(2) of the RMA. An NPS is a vehicle for the government to prescribe objectives and policies for matters which are relevant to sustainable management. All National Policy Statements currently in force are published on the Ministry's website and links are provided in the table below. It is recommended that you consider the relevance of each NPS to your project. If you are seeking an RMA approval, then under section 13(4)(y)(i) and schedule 5 paragraph 2 of the FTAA your application must include an assessment of your project against any relevant NPSs. Arataki Fast Track Consent proposal – Havelock North

Thank you for the recent opportunity to discuss the Arataki Fast Track Consent proposal for a development of 171 residential dwellings, located at 86, 108 and 122 Arataki Road, Havelock North.

The Ministry has reviewed the application plan and site context information provided, which shows the draft concept plan for the subdivision and development of the residential dwellings. We can advise that the Ministry of Education has no particular issues to raise with the application at this stage.

The site is identified within the draft Future Development Strategy for 110 dwellings and has long been signalled for residential development including through the Heretaunga Plains Urban Development Strategy. As such, the development of this site for residential dwellings is not unanticipated. There is capacity in the schooling network to accommodate the level of growth anticipated by this proposed development.

There are a number of schools within easy walking distance of the site, including Te Mata School, Havelock North Intermediate and Havelock North High School. We anticipate that the application will address how the proposal will manage transport effects at the nearby schools both during construction and once fully developed. We note and support provisions in the proposed development for active modes of transport, with connectivity to existing on- and off-road pedestrian pathways, providing linkages through the existing suburb to the nearby schools. We do request that particular consideration is given to pedestrian and cyclist safety in the design of the proposed Jointly Owned Access Lots.

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

I'm getting in touch to provide an early heads-up on a Fast Track project we're progressing for the Arataki development in Hawke's Bay. The project is listed under Schedule 2 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024, and we're aiming to lodge the Substantive Application with the EPA at the end of May. We are acting on behalf of the landowner, CDL Land New Zealand Limited (**CDL**).

The site is located at 86, 108, and 122 Arataki Road, Havelock North, and comprises approximately 11 hectares. It sits at the eastern edge of the existing urban area, around 2.5 kilometres from the Havelock North Village Centre and approximately 800 metres from the cluster of schools on Te Mata Road and Nimon Street (Te Mata School, Havelock North Intermediate, and Havelock North High School).

The proposal will deliver 171 new residential dwellings and has been designed with a strong focus on walkability, urban amenity, and providing a considered rural-urban interface. In particular, the development prioritises safe and direct pedestrian and cycle connections to the surrounding road network, which already offers good pedestrian infrastructure linking to the local schools.

A draft scheme plan is **attached**, along with a context plan illustrating the site's proximity to the school cluster.

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

I'm getting in touch regarding a Fast Track project we're progressing for the Arataki development in Havelock North. The project is listed under Schedule 2 of the Fast-track Approvals Act 2024 (**FTAA**), and we're aiming to lodge the Substantive Application with the EPA in mid-July. We are acting on behalf of the landowner, CDL Land New Zealand Limited (**CDL**).

The proposal involves 171 new residential dwellings across an 11-hectare site at 86, 108, and 122 Arataki Road, located approximately 2.5 kilometres from the Havelock North Village Centre. The development has been designed with a strong focus on walkability, urban amenity, and providing a high-quality rural-urban interface.

As part of the Fast Track process, we're seeking feedback from the Ministry of Health on the proposal, particularly in relation to local health infrastructure and whether the existing healthcare services (including GP access and proximity to hospital facilities) can accommodate the projected increase in population from the development.
