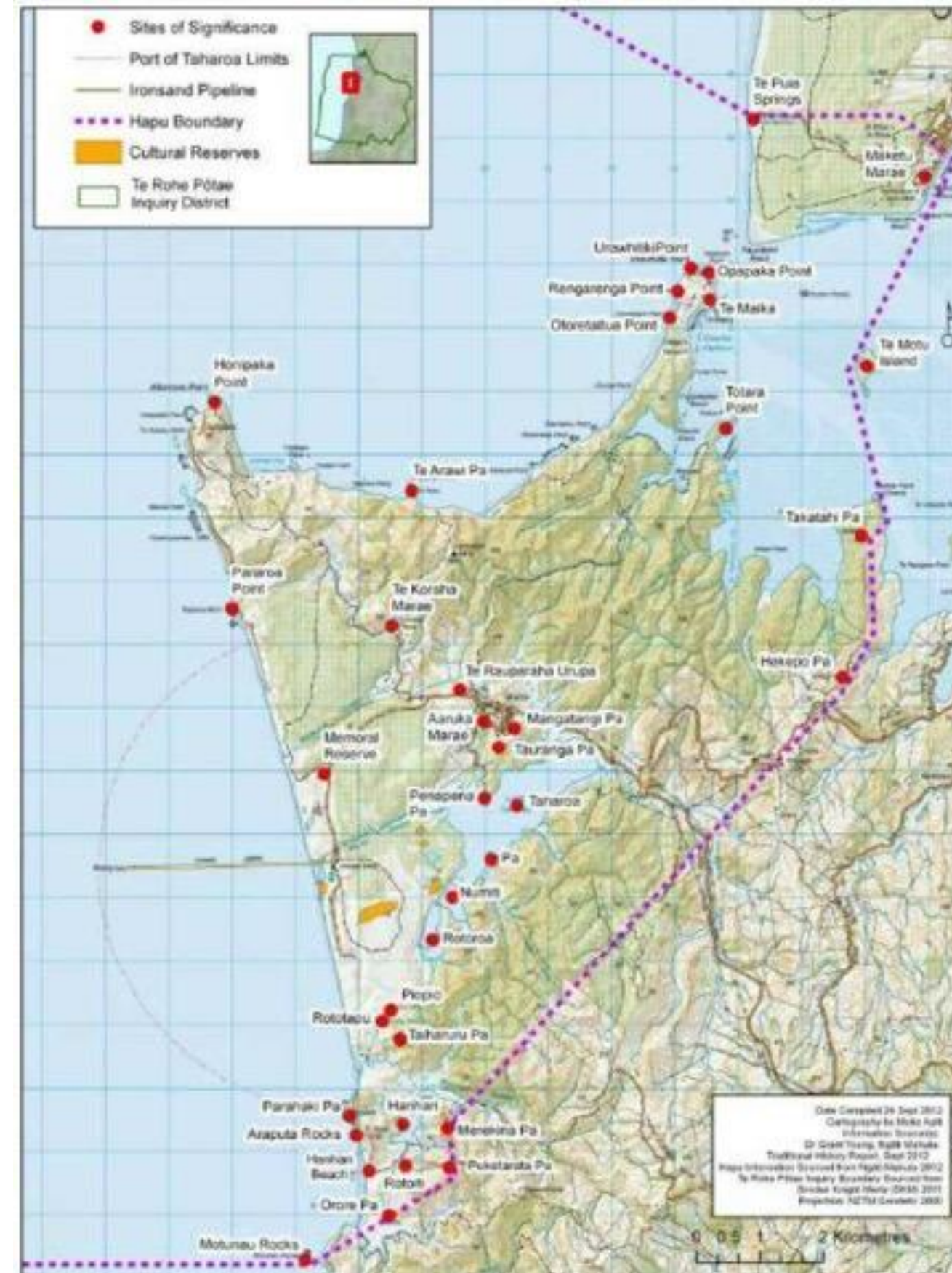
- Taupiri & Ōrangiwahao – maunga

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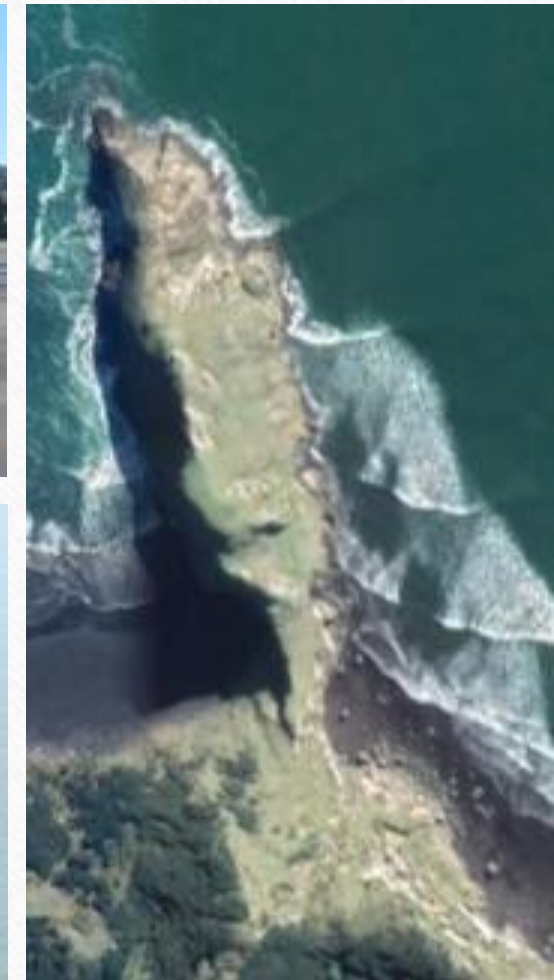
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Ngāti Rangitaka & Te Kooraha

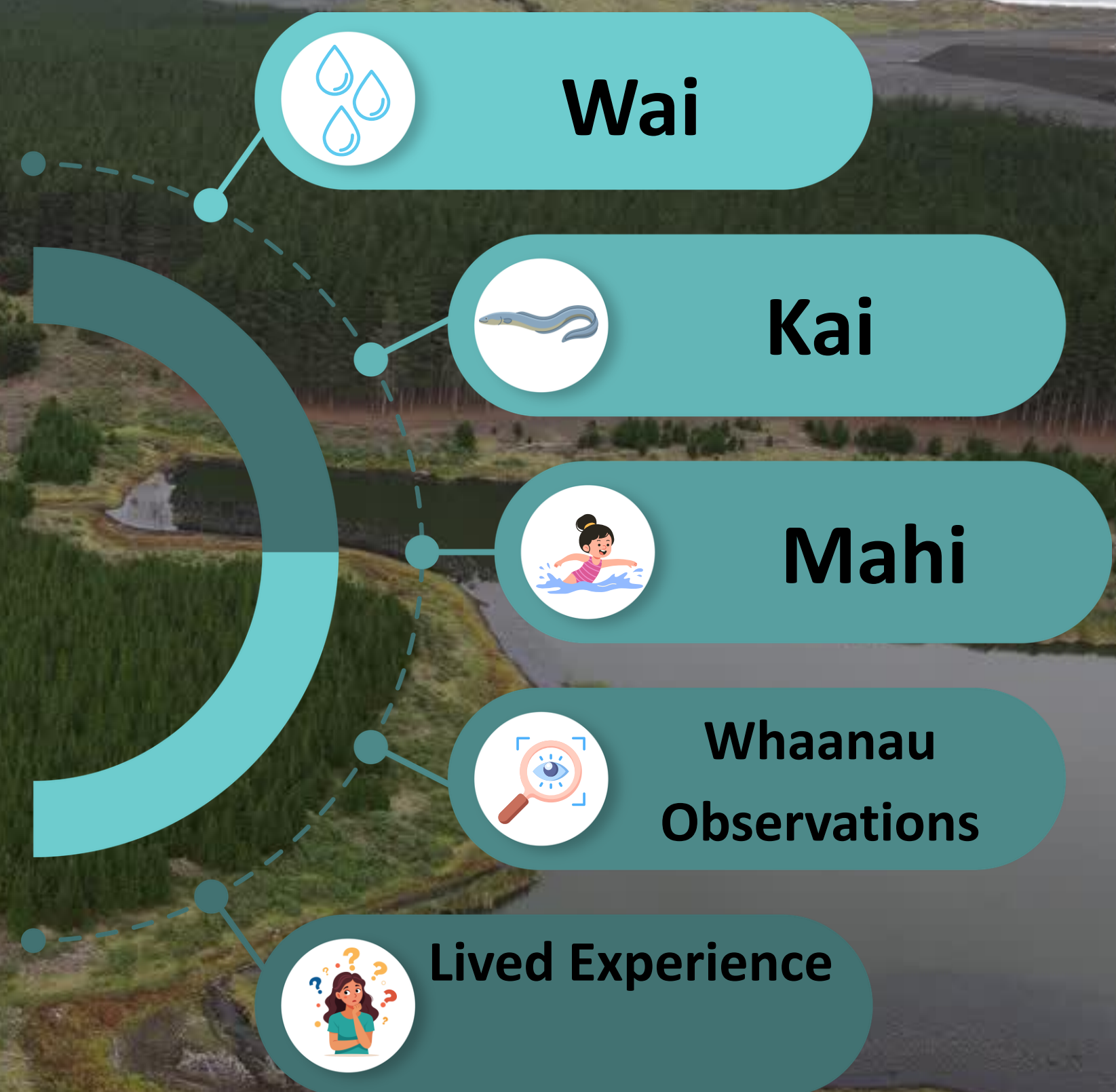

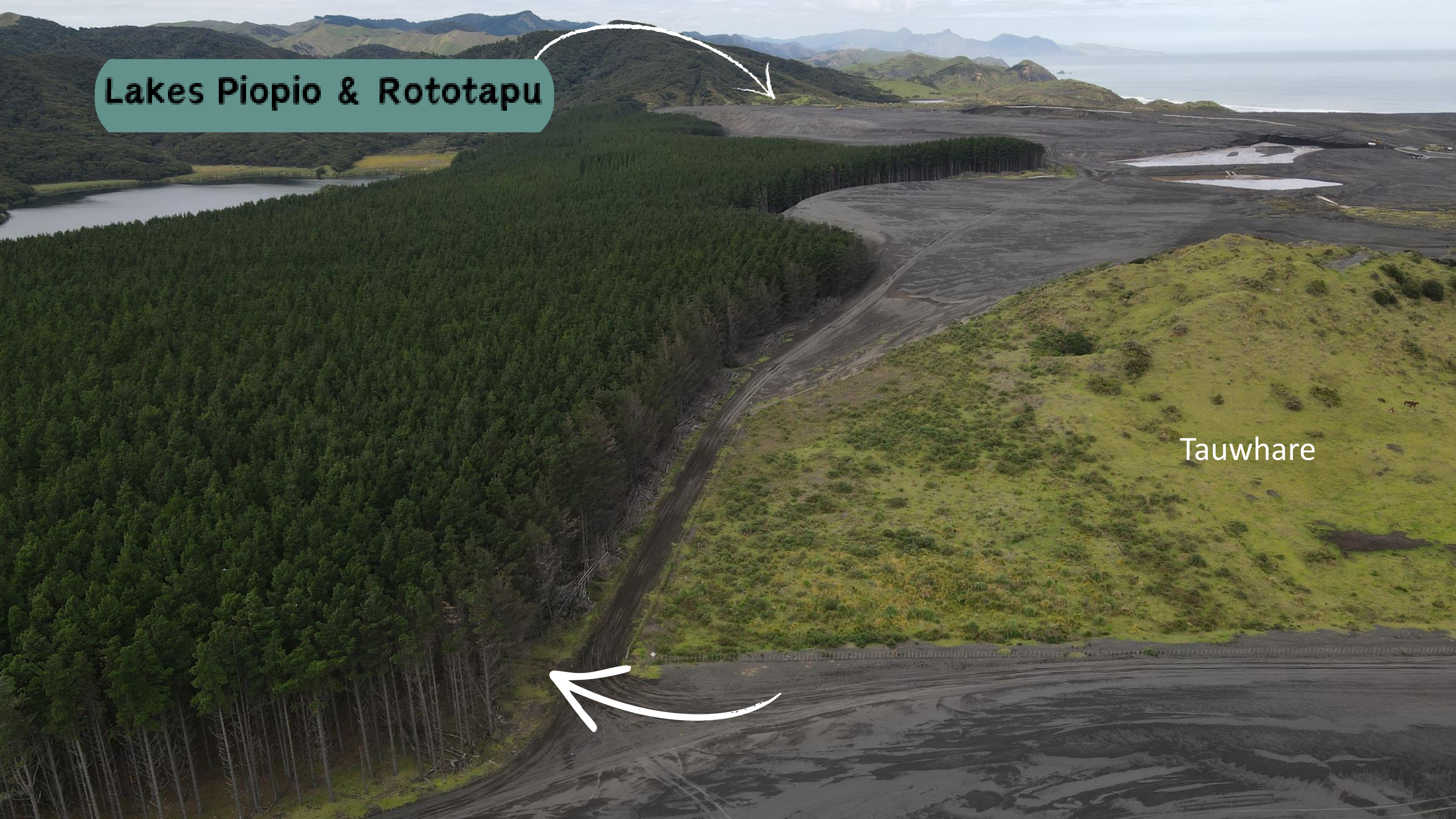

Our Position

- We do not support the substantive application in its current form and seek amendments and appropriate conditions.
- Significant concerns remain regarding groundwater drawdown, hydrological changes, and effects on wetland systems.
- Ecological effects are not limited to individual species but relate to the overall health and functioning of interconnected ecosystems.
- A precautionary approach is necessary where uncertainty remains.
- Monitoring must include meaningful mana whenua involvement and recognition of cultural indicators alongside technical monitoring.
